A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE SMALL BOAT HARBOR PERMITS AND FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
- 2 land and natural resources' division of boating and ocean
- 3 recreation is responsible for operating and maintaining the
- 4 state's small boat harbors among the division's other
- 5 responsibilities.
- 6 The legislature further finds that, during the regular
- 7 sessions of 2018 and 2021, the legislature enacted legislation
- 8 to grant the division of boating and ocean recreation fee
- 9 increases to address the need to generate sufficient revenue to
- 10 discharge the divisions small boat harbor responsibilities.
- 11 The legislature also recognizes that the interests of the
- 12 department of land and natural resources and those who are
- 13 permitted to live aboard their vessels may appear to be in
- 14 conflict.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to clarify the department of
- 16 land and natural resources' responsibilities and procedures for
- 17 the cost-effective maintenance of harbors.

1	SECTION 2. Section 200-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) Vessels used for purposes of recreational boating
4	activities that are also the principal habitation of the owner
5	shall occupy no more than one hundred twenty-nine berths at A
6	Wai boat harbor and thirty-five berths at Keehi boat harbor,
7	which is equal to fifteen per cent of the respective total
8	moorage space that was available as of July 1, 1976, at the A
9	Wai and Keehi boat harbors[-]; provided that:
10	(1) The department may accept principal habitation perm
11	applications from holders of mooring permits upon
12	receipt of a completed application on a form
13	prescribed by the department, together with the
14	payment of an application fee set by the department
15	(2) The department may issue available principal
16	habitation permits up to the maximum amount set by
17	this section; and
18	(3) The department may establish a waiting list and
19	corresponding waiting list fee for principal
20	habitation permit applicants to hold their place in

1	the queue for pending principal habitation permit
2	applications."
3	SECTION 3. Section 200-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	mended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
5	"(c) The permittee shall pay moorage fees to the
6	department for the use permit that shall be based on but not
7	imited to the use of the vessel, the vessel's effect on the
8	narbor, use of facilities, and the cost of administering the
9	nooring program; provided that:
10	(1) Except for commercial maritime activities in which a
11	tariff is established by the department of
12	transportation, moorage fees shall be established by
13	appraisal by a state-licensed appraiser approved by
14	the department;
15	(2) For commercial maritime activities in which a tariff
16	is established by the harbors division of the
17	department of transportation, the department may adopt
18	the published tariff of the harbors division of the
19	department of transportation or establish the fee by
20	appraisal by a state-licensed appraiser approved by
21	the department;

1	(3)	An application led shall be collected when applying
2		for moorage in state small boat harbors and shall
3		thereafter be collected annually when the application
4		is renewed; provided that the application fee shall be
5		set by the department[+] except as otherwise provided
6		by law;
7	(4)	If a recreational vessel is used as a place of
8		principal habitation, the permittee shall pay[, in
9		lieu of the moorage] a mooring permit fee as required
10		by paragraph (1), and a [monthly liveaboard] principal
11		<pre>habitation fee [that shall be two times the moorage]</pre>
12		equal to the mooring permit fee that would [otherwise]
13		be assessed for a vessel of the same size;
14	(5)	If a vessel is used for commercial purposes from the
15		vessel's permitted mooring, the permittee shall pay,
16		in lieu of the moorage fee required by paragraph (1),
17		a monthly fee that shall be the greater of:
18		(A) Three per cent of the gross revenues derived from
19		the use of the vessel;
20		(B) \$1.50 per passenger carried for hire; or

1		(C) Two times the moorage fee that would otherwise be
2		assessed for a recreational vessel of the same
3		size;
4	(6)	The department is authorized to assess and collect
5		utility fees, including electrical and water charges,
6		and common-area maintenance fees in small boat
7		harbors; provided that if the utility fee is paid by
8		the permittee, the permittee shall only be responsible
9		for paying common-area maintenance fees; provided
10		further that if a permittee has a properly installed
11		meter or sub-meter, the utility fees shall be based on
12		the metered or sub-metered usage records; and
13	(7)	All fees established by appraisal pursuant to this
14		subsection shall be set at fair market value $[-]$;
15		provided that no fee may be changed more than once in
16		any twelve-month period commencing on the date on
17		which the prior fee became effective."
