A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that as of 2021, there
- 2 are more than four hundred patients in the State waiting for
- 3 heart, liver, kidney, or pancreas transplants, and even more in
- 4 need of cornea or bone marrow transplants. Although
- 5 approximately sixty-three per cent of the eligible population in
- 6 the State are registered organ donors, there is still a need for
- 7 more organ donors to meet the needs of the many patients waiting
- 8 for an organ.
- 9 Research shows that the actual percentage of the eliqible
- 10 population who are willing to be organ donors is much higher
- 11 than sixty-three per cent. This discrepancy occurs because an
- 12 applicant may fail to check "yes" to being an organ donor on the
- 13 driver's license application or driver's license renewal
- 14 application. The State's current driver's license and renewal
- 15 application only has a "yes" option for organ donation and if
- 16 the box is left blank, the application is still accepted and it

- 1 is presumed that the applicant does not wish to be an organ
- 2 donor.
- 3 The legislature finds that the percentage of eligible
- 4 individuals who are willing to be organ donors can be increased
- 5 by requiring an applicant to affirmatively choose "yes" or "no"
- 6 as to whether they want to be an organ donor. Research has
- 7 shown that requiring an applicant to affirmatively state their
- 8 organ donation preference greatly increases the percentage of
- 9 individuals willing to be organ donors.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 11 (1) Require an applicant for a Hawaii driver's license or
- driver's license renewal to affirmatively select
- either "yes" or "no" as to whether the applicant
- 14 wishes to be an organ donor; and
- 15 (2) Require the applicant to be provided with a brochure
- 16 about organ donation at the time of application.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 286-107, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
- "(e) No driver's license shall be renewed by the examiner
- 20 of drivers unless:

1	(1)	The examiner of drivers is satisfied of the
2		applicant's fitness to continue to operate a motor
3		vehicle;
4	(2)	The fee required by subsection (d) is tendered
5		together with the application for renewal; [and]
6	(3)	The applicant complies with section 286-102.5[:]; and
7	(4)	The applicant has affirmatively indicated on the
8		application whether the applicant wishes to be an
9		organ donor in the event of the applicant's death."
10	SECT	ION 3. Section 286-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
12	"(a)	Except as provided in section 286-107.5(a), the
13	examiner	of drivers shall examine every applicant for a driver's
14	license,	except as otherwise provided in this part. The
15	examination	on shall include a test of:
16	(1)	The applicant's eyesight and any further physical
17		examination that the examiner of drivers finds
18		necessary to determine the applicant's fitness to
19		operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways;
20	(2)	The applicant's ability to understand highway signs
21		regulating, warning, and directing traffic;

1	(3)	The applicant's knowledge of the rules of the road
2		based on the traffic laws of the State and the traffic
3		ordinances of the county where the applicant resides
4		or intends to operate a motor vehicle; provided that
5		the examination shall specifically test the
6		applicant's knowledge of the provisions of section
7		291C-121.5 and section 291C-137; and
8	(4)	The actual demonstration of ability to exercise
9		ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a
10		motor vehicle.
11	The exami	nations shall be appropriate to the operation of the
12	category	of motor vehicle for which the applicant seeks to be
13	licensed	and shall be conducted as required by the director.
14	The	examiner of drivers shall require every applicant to
15	comply wi	th section 286-102.5.
16	The	examiner of drivers may waive the actual demonstration
17	of ability	y to operate a motorcycle or motor scooter for any
18	person who	o furnishes evidence, to the satisfaction of the
19	examiner	of drivers, that the person has completed the
20	motorcycl	e education course approved by the director in
21	accordance	e with section 431:10G-104.

1 At the time of examination, an informational brochure about 2 organ donation shall be made available to every applicant for a 3 driver's license by the examiner of drivers. 4 For the purposes of this section, the term "applicant" does 5 not include any person reactivating a license under section 6 286-107.5(a)." 7 SECTION 4. Section 286-109.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 "\$286-109.5 Designation of anatomical gift. The examiner 10 of drivers shall design and implement a system to request 11 anatomical gift information from all applicants for a driver's license or license renewal, at the time of application, 12 13 including a method of directly imprinting on a license an 14 applicant's designation of whether the applicant wishes to be an 15 organ donor. The request shall elicit either a "yes" or "no" 16 response as to whether the applicant wishes to be an organ donor 17 in the event of the applicant's death. The examiner of drivers 18 shall also design a brochure explaining organ donation that 19 shall be made available to all applicants for a driver's license 20 or license renewal."

1 SECTION 5. Section 286-111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows: 3 "(d) Every application shall state the full name, date of birth, gender designation, occupation, veteran status if 4 applicable (including veterans of the Korean conflict and 5 6 persons who served in the armed forces of the Republic of Korea, 7 who fought under the command of the United Nations led by the 8 United States, during the Korean conflict and are currently 9 United States citizens) and desired by the applicant, social 10 security number if the applicant is eligible for a social 11 security number, whether or not the applicant wishes to be an 12 organ donor in the event of the applicant's death, the residence 13 address, and business address, if any, of the applicant, shall 14 briefly describe the applicant, and shall state whether the 15 applicant has theretofore been licensed as a driver, and, if so, when and in what state or country, and whether any such license 16 17 has ever been suspended or revoked, or whether an application 18 has ever been refused, and if so, the date of and reason for the 19 suspension, revocation, or refusal. The examiner of drivers shall not require documentation for 20

an applicant's selection of gender designation or an applicant's

- 1 request for an amendment to a gender designation other than the
- 2 applicant's self-certification of their chosen gender
- 3 designation; provided that the examiner of drivers shall not be
- 4 prohibited from requiring documentation that may incidentally
- 5 show an applicant's birth sex category if the documentation is
- 6 necessary to establish that the applicant is legally entitled to
- 7 a license.
- 8 For purposes of this subsection, "gender designation" shall
- 9 have the same meaning as in section 286-109(a)."
- 10 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Driver's Licenses; Organ Donation

Description:

Requires an applicant for a driver's license or renewal of a driver's license to designate whether the applicant wishes to be an organ donor in the event of the applicant's death by providing a "yes" or "no" response. Requires the examiner of drivers to design and provide an informational brochure about organ donation to each applicant for driver's license or driver's license renewal.
