## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. (a) There is established the blockchain and cryptocurrency task force to be placed within the department of commerce and consumer affairs for administrative purposes.

- (b) The task force shall consist of the following members:
- (1) Three members of the senate and three members of the house of representatives who shall be appointed by the president of the senate and speaker of the house of representatives, respectively; provided that not more than four of the members shall be of the same political party; provided further that the president of the senate and speaker of the house of representatives shall designate one member each to serve as co-chairpersons of the task force;
- (2) The director of finance or the director's designee;
- (3) A representative from the department of commerce and consumer affairs' division of financial institutions;

1	(4)	A president or chief financial officer of a Hawaii-
2		based cryptocurrency company who shall be appointed by
3		the governor;
4	(5)	A representative from a Hawaii-based bank or financial
5		institution who shall be appointed by the governor;
6	(6)	A representative of a Hawaii-based cryptocurrency
7		exchange who shall be appointed by the governor;
8	(7)	A representative of a Hawaii-based company with a
9		focus on non-transactional blockchains who shall be
10		appointed by the governor;
11	(8)	A representative of a Hawaii-based blockchain payments
12		solution company who shall be appointed by the
13		governor;
14	(9)	A professor from the University of Hawaii who
15		specializes in blockchain who shall be appointed by
16		the governor;
17	(10)	A representative of a company with a business model
18		that uses blockchain for non-cryptocurrency
19		transaction purposes who shall be appointed by the
20		governor.

1	(11)	A representative of a blockchain or cryptocurrency
2		association who shall be appointed by the governor;
3		and
4	(12)	One member of the public who shall be appointed by the
5		governor.
6	(c)	The task force shall:
7	(1)	Meet as often as the chairperson deems necessary;
8	(2)	Review data on the scope of blockchain and
9		cryptocurrency throughout the country;
10	(3)	Review other aspects of the blockchain and
11		cryptocurrency industry, including but not limited to
12		the development of a plan to expand blockchain
13		adoption in both the private and public sectors;
14	(4)	Compile an overview of potential legislation;
15	(5)	Solicit ideas and opinions of industry experts on
16		additional legislation; and
17	(6)	Submit a report of its findings and recommendations,
18		including any proposed legislation, to the legislature
19		no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
20		the regular session of 2023.

- 1 (d) The members of the task force shall not be compensated
- for their services, but shall be reimbursed for necessary
- 3 expenses, including travel expenses, incurred while
- 4 participating in meetings and events approved by the
- 5 chairpersons. No member of the task force shall be made subject
- 6 to chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because of the
- 7 member's participation in the task force.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
