A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EARLY CHILDHOOD REGISTRY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a strong early
- 2 childcare and education workforce is necessary to support
- 3 Hawaii's children, working families, and communities. The
- 4 legislature further finds that the demand for quality early
- 5 childcare and education far exceeds the currently available and
- 6 qualified early childcare capacity of the State. The
- 7 legislature also finds that disruptions to the early childcare
- 8 and education system due to the ongoing coronavirus disease 2019
- 9 pandemic have created more challenges to expanding access to
- 10 quality, affordable early childcare and education programs.
- 11 According to the Center for the Study of Child Care
- 12 Employment, the lack of early childcare and education workforce
- 13 data prevents policymakers from understanding the needs of this
- 14 workforce, which may then lead to inefficiencies regarding
- 15 legislation for early childcare and education programs. The
- 16 legislature recognizes that workforce registries have been used
- 17 to provide an objective framework for professional development

- 1 and compensation. The legislature further recognizes that
- 2 timely, clear, and detailed data on early childcare workers and
- 3 educators is critical to ensure and increase the quality of
- 4 these workers and educators in the State, and will help to craft
- 5 data-informed policies.
- 6 Currently, the department of human services only requires
- 7 the staff used to meet the staff-child ratio in licensed
- 8 childcare facilities to enroll and update their information on
- 9 its early childhood registry. Given the need to expand the
- 10 availability of access to high-quality early childcare and
- 11 education programs in the State, the legislature also recognizes
- 12 that data in the Hawaii early childhood registry must be
- 13 consistently collected and analyzed.
- 14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to address the
- 15 needs of Hawaii's early childcare and education workforce by
- 16 requiring the department of human services to annually collect
- 17 certain information from all early childcare workers and
- 18 educators in the State through its early childhood registry.
- 19 SECTION 2. The department of human services shall require
- 20 all staff used to meet the staff-child ratio in both licensed
- 21 and registered childcare programs in the State to annually

- 1 update their information in its early childhood registry. The
- 2 data collected from the early childhood registry shall include
- 3 social determinates, including but not limited to: gender,
- 4 race, age, paid years of experience, preferred learning
- 5 languages, languages spoken with children, median hourly wage,
- 6 paid planning time, health insurance, paid sick leave, paid
- 7 vacation, retirement benefits, participation in an
- 8 apprenticeship program, level of education, and training hours.
- 9 Training includes but is not limited to health and safety
- 10 training and voluntary professional development training. The
- 11 data collected shall not include the first or last names of
- 12 staff members.
- 13 SECTION 3. The department of human services shall submit a
- 14 report of its findings and recommendations, including any
- 15 proposed legislation, regarding updates to the early childhood
- 16 registry to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
- 17 the convening of the regular session of 2024.
- 18 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$80,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the
- 21 purpose of improving the State's early childhood registry.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on December 31,
- 4 2050.
