### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that educating Hawaii's
- 2 people leads to creative solutions and innovation for the State
- 3 to thrive. In 2021, the governor awarded \$8.1 million in
- 4 innovative programs across the State as part of the governor's
- 5 emergency education relief (GEER) fund. With the onset of the
- 6 coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, GEER grants allow
- 7 schools, colleges, and other educational entities across the
- 8 State to engage in science, technology, engineering, and
- 9 mathematics (STEM) education, project-based learning, and
- 10 leadership development programs to reimagine various sectors for
- 11 the post-COVID-19 environment.
- 12 The legislature further finds that higher and continuing
- 13 education reduces recidivism, as higher education is linked to
- 14 higher levels of employment. Utilizing the GEER grant, the
- 15 department of public safety, in partnership with the University
- 16 of Hawaii, McKinley community school for adults, and Hawaii
- 17 friends for restorative justice, created the higher and

- 1 continuing education program to support women incarcerated at
- 2 the women's community correctional center. The higher and
- 3 continuing education program provides key resources to women who
- 4 wish to pursue higher education through re-entry programs and
- 5 transition services post-incarceration. The GEER grant program
- 6 further allows incarcerated women to achieve higher education
- 7 goals while also reducing the risk of recidivism.
- 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 9 funds to extend the higher and continuing education program at
- 10 women's community correctional center.
- 11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to fund
- 14 the higher and continuing education program, which shall:
- 15 (1) Train incarcerated women to become general education
- development (GED) tutors for their peers;
- 17 (2) Maintain the Windward community college program
- 18 established at women's community correctional center
- after grant funding lapses in June of 2022;
- 20 (3) Provide college correspondence courses for women at
- women's community correctional center; and

1	(4) Provide re-entry and transition services for women who
2	wish to continue their education post-incarceration.
3	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
4	public safety for the purposes of this Act.
5	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
