A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECIDIVISM PREVENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) There is established within the department 2 of public safety reentry office, a five-year recidivism 3 prevention pilot program, consisting of three components: the 4 housing voucher program, child care voucher program, and tax 5 credit for employers, to assist the reentry efforts of program 6 participants for two years following the individual's exit from 7 a correctional center. 8 A program participant shall be an individual: 9 (1) Who is a resident of Hawaii; 10 (2) Who exited from the women's community correctional 11 center; 12 (3) Whose household income does not exceed eighty per cent 13 of the area median income; and 14 (4) Who is employed and either: 15 (A) Works for twenty or more hours in a workweek; or

7	(h) The department shall submit a report of its findings
8	and recommendations pertaining to the pilot program to the
9	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
10	the regular session of 2027. The report shall include:
11	(1) A record of pilot program activities and
12	accomplishments;
13	(2) A recommendation on whether the pilot program should
14	be continued, modified, or terminated, including
15	whether the assistance under the pilot program should
16	be extended to other correctional centers; and
17	(3) Any proposed legislation.
18	(i) As used in this Act:
19	"Child" means an unmarried individual who is under eighteen
20	years of age. "Child" includes a biological, adopted, or foster

child; a stepchild; and a legal ward.

1 "Child care facility" shall have the same meaning as 2 defined section 346-151, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 3 "Child care subsidy" shall have the same meaning as defined section 346-151, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 4 5 "Department" means the department of public safety. "Pilot program" means the five-year recidivism prevention 6 7 pilot program established pursuant to this Act. 8 There is appropriated out of the general 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for 11 the implementation and operation of the five-year recidivism 12 prevention pilot program and for the establishment of five full-13 time equivalent (5.00 FTE) permanent transition navigator 14 positions within the department of public safety reentry office; provided that the transition navigators shall provide assistance 15 16 to individuals exiting the women's community correctional center in successfully rejoining their families and the community. 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 18 19 public safety for the purposes of this Act.
