A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION GRANTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTI	ON 1. For the purposes of this Act:
2	"Asse	ssment" means an examination or other objective
3	evaluation	of a student's academic performance, academic
4	engagement	, or college or career readiness.
5	"Cont	ractor" means an individual or entity with whom the
6	department	enters into a contract for the purpose of performing
7	a program	function.
8	"Depa:	rtment" means the department of education.
9	"Elig	ible education expenses" means:
10	(1)	Computer hardware, Internet access, or other
11		technological devices or services that are primarily
12	1	used to meet a participant's educational needs;
13	(2)	Textbooks, curriculum, or other instructional
14	ī	materials, including educational software and
15	i	applications;
16	(3)	Fees for national standardized assessments, advanced
17	ì	olacement examinations, examinations related to

college or university admissions, or industry-1 recognized certification examinations; 2 (4)Therapies including but not limited to occupational, 3 behavioral, physical, speech-language, and audiology 5 therapies, or other services or therapies specifically 6 approved by the department; and 7 (5) Supplemental education services. "Eligible student" means a student attending a public 8 9 school in grades kindergarten through twelve. "Grant" means an award of \$1,000 that shall be used for 10 11 eligible education expenses. "Grant distribution platform" means a device through which 12 grant funds are transferred from the department to the parents 13 14 of participants. "Parent" means a parent or legal guardian of an eligible 15 16 student or participant. "Participant" means an eligible student for whom a grant is 17 awarded under the program. 18 "Program" means the strong students grant pilot program. 19

8	(d)	To administer the program, the department shall:
9	(1)	Establish a grant application process for parents of
10		eligible students who apply for the program;
11	(2)	Select a third party to build a grant distribution
12		<pre>platform;</pre>
13	(3)	Administer, or select a third party to administer, the
14		grant distribution platform; and
15	(4)	Subject to appropriation, award grants to qualified
16		students under this Act.
17	(c)	The department may:
18	(1)	Retain other contractors as necessary to administer
19		the program and delegate program functions to the

3	(d)	The awarding of grants shall be made to eligible

9	(2)	Starting on September 15 of each calendar year,

(e) Notification of grant awards for eligible students
under subsection (d)(1) shall be made within thirty days from
the department's receipt of the application from the parent of
the eligible student. Grant funds under subsection (d)(1) shall
be made available for participants' use as soon as practicable

provided that applications for program grants shall not be

accepted after December 1 of each calendar year.

- 3 (f) Prior to the award of a grant, the parent of a
- 4 participant shall agree to verify compliance with the program

- 6 (q) If a parent of a participant is found to misuse grant
- 7 funds, then neither the parent nor another parent of the
- 8 participant living in the same household may apply for any
- 9 future program grants; provided that a parent may appeal the
- 10 finding of misuse to the department.
- 11 (h) Grant funds under the program shall be expended in the
- 12 fiscal year in which the funds are awarded and shall only be
- 13 used for eligible education expenses. Any unused funds at the
- 14 end of a fiscal year shall revert to the state general fund.
- 15 SECTION 3. (a) The department shall submit a report to
- 16 the legislature on its efforts to establish the strong students
- 17 grant pilot program established by this Act, including any
- 18 findings and recommendations, no later than twenty days prior to
- 19 the convening of the regular session of 2023.
- 20 (b) The department shall submit a report to the
- 21 legislature on its efforts to implement the strong students

- 1 grant pilot program established by this Act, including any
- 2 findings and recommendations, no later than twenty days prior to
- 3 the convening of the regular session of 2024.
- 4 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to
- 7 establish and administer the strong students grant pilot program
- 8 established by this Act.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
