### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHER COMPENSATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the recruitment and
- 2 retention of qualified teachers is essential to the success of
- 3 Hawaii's public education system. The State continues to face a
- 4 chronic teacher shortage, which undermines student learning and
- 5 achievement. For the 2018-2019 school year, the department of
- 6 education experienced a qualified teacher shortage of one
- 7 thousand twenty-nine positions.
- 8 The legislature further finds that research indicates that
- 9 competitive and equitable compensation correlates with greater
- 10 success in recruiting and retaining qualified educators. Yet,
- 11 numerous studies have shown that Hawaii's teacher salaries are
- 12 the lowest in the nation when adjusted for the State's high cost
- 13 of living.
- 14 The legislature also finds that teacher salaries are
- 15 unequal when experienced senior teachers are aligned with less
- 16 senior teachers in their placement within the existing salary
- 17 schedules. Unfair pay scales have driven experienced senior



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- 1 teachers to either retire early or leave the profession, due to
- 2 the perception that their experience and dedication to public
- 3 education and the teaching profession will never be adequately
- 4 valued and recognized.
- 5 The legislature further finds that an increasing number of
- 6 school districts around the country are utilizing compensation
- 7 methods and strategies designed to improve the recruitment and
- 8 retention of qualified teachers.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to fund an experimental
- 10 modernization project pursuant to section 78-3.5, Hawaii Revised
- 11 Statutes, to address compensation equity issues and to make the
- 12 necessary discretionary salary adjustments for approximately
- 13 eight thousand seven hundred experienced senior teachers by
- 14 recognizing their professional service to the department of
- 15 education through discretionary salary adjustments.
- 16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 18 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to
- 19 fund an experimental modernization project pursuant to section
- 20 78-3.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as negotiated between the
- 21 superintendent of education and the exclusive representative of



- 1 collective bargaining unit (5) in a memorandum of understanding
- 2 to address compensation equity issues and make the necessary
- 3 discretionary salary adjustments for approximately eight
- 4 thousand seven hundred teachers whose current base salary does
- 5 not reflect their years of professional service; provided that
- 6 the moneys shall not be released until the memorandum of
- 7 understanding is executed between the superintendent of
- 8 education and the exclusive representative of collective
- 9 bargaining unit (5).
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 11 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 14 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
- 15 charter schools (EDN 600) to fund an experimental modernization
- 16 project pursuant to section 78-3.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as
- 17 negotiated between the state public charter school commission
- 18 and the exclusive representative of collective bargaining unit
- 19 (5) in a memorandum of understanding to address compensation
- 20 equity issues and make the necessary discretionary salary
- 21 adjustments for teachers whose current base salary does not

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- 1 reflect their years of professional service; provided that the
- 2 moneys shall not be released until the memorandum of
- 3 understanding is executed between the state public charter
- 4 school commission and the exclusive representative of collective
- 5 bargaining unit (5).
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state public
- 7 charter school commission for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
