A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that during the
- 2 coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, Pacific Islander
- 3 communities have been affected by COVID-19 at higher numbers
- 4 than any other community of color in the State. Compact of Free
- 5 Association benefit recipients have been particularly adversely
- 6 impacted. Unfortunately, many Compact of Free Association
- 7 benefit recipients have experienced prejudice and discrimination
- 8 in the health care system and no longer use medical facilities
- 9 as a first option to treat illnesses. Compact of Free
- 10 Association benefit recipients instead use these facilities as
- 11 an option of last resort that often results in a much more
- 12 severe prognosis than if the patient had received treatment at
- 13 an earlier stage.
- 14 The legislature further finds that, with the reinstatement
- 15 of the medicaid and children's health insurance program by the
- 16 United States Congress on December 20, 2020, Compact of Free
- 17 Association benefit recipients are now able to participate in

3	estimated the number of Compact of Free Association benefit			
4	recipients in the State to be approximately sixteen thousand			
5	persons. Therefore, investing in programs to bridge the			
6	cultural and language gaps between health care providers and			
7	Compact of Free Association benefit recipients, as well as other			
8	communities with similar cultural and language barriers, will			
9	help to alleviate the financial burden on the State and mitigate			
10	revenue loss by medical facilities that provide service and care			
11	for individuals who are uninsured.			
12	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:			
13	(1) Require that the Hawaii health systems corporation			
14	convene a task force to facilitate improved, mission-			
15	driven hiring and training of culturally-accepted

3	SECTION 2. (a) The Hawaii health systems corporation
4	shall convene a task force to facilitate improved, mission-
5	driven hiring and training of culturally-accepted interpreters
6	and create culturally-accepted educational materials on
7	preventative care and early intervention to assist non-English
8	speaking populations seeking care at health care facilities.
9	The task force shall include the following members:
10	(1) The chief executive officer of the Hawaii health
11	systems corporation, who shall serve as chair of the

13	(2) The director of health, or the director's designee;
14	(3) The director of human services, or the director's
15	designee;
16	(4) One representative from The Queen's Health Systems,
17	who shall be invited to participate by the chair;

- 6 (b) The members of the task force shall serve without
 7 compensation but may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses,
 8 including travel expenses, incurred for serving on the task
 9 force. No member shall be made subject to chapter 84, Hawaii
 10 Revised Statutes, solely because of that member's participation
 11 as a member of the task force.
- (c) The task force, with the assistance of the Hawaii

 health systems corporation and department of health, shall

 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including

 any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than

 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of

 2024.
- 18 (d) The task force shall be dissolved on June 30, 2024.

 19 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
