A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A SCHOOL SUPPLY SUBSIDY PILOT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Title I, Part A, of
- 2 the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the
- 3 Every Student Succeeds Act (Title I), provides federal financial
- 4 assistance to local educational agencies and schools with high
- 5 percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure
- 6 educational success.
- 7 The legislature further finds that a pilot program to
- 8 subsidize school supplies for schools composed entirely of
- 9 students eliqible for participation in Title I, such as Naalehu
- 10 elementary school, would be useful to identify methods for
- 11 relieving the financial burden of education on low-income
- 12 families. Many students who attend Naalehu elementary school
- 13 live in rural areas across Kau and experience geographical
- 14 challenges, such as limited opportunities and isolation from
- 15 educational resources.
- 16 The legislature further finds that, as an exemplar, based
- 17 on the school supplies list for the 2021-2022 school year at



- 1 Naalehu elementary school and the average cost of school
- 2 supplies at local stores, the cost for school supplies by grade
- 3 are as follows: grade one, \$4,451.58; grade two, \$1,605.86;
- 4 grade three, \$3,646.08; grade four, \$5,186.94; grade five,
- 5 \$4,913.63; and grade six, \$3,969.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to establish and make an
- 7 appropriation for a one-year school supply subsidy pilot program
- 8 at all schools composed entirely of students eligible for
- 9 participation in Title I, including but not limited to Naalehu
- 10 elementary school.
- 11 SECTION 2. (a) Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year,
- 12 the department of education shall establish and implement a one-
- 13 year school supply subsidy pilot program at all schools composed
- 14 entirely of students eligible for participation in Title I,
- 15 including but not limited to Naalehu elementary school.
- 16 (b) The department of education shall submit a report of
- 17 its findings and recommendations regarding the school supply
- 18 subsidy pilot program, including any proposed legislation, to
- 19 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 20 of the regular session of 2024.

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to
- 4 establish and implement a one-year school supply subsidy pilot
- 5 program at all schools composed entirely of students eligible
- 6 for participation in Title I, including but not limited to
- 7 Naalehu elementary school.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 9 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050, and
- 11 shall be repealed on January 1, 2024.
