A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FAMILY PLANNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii has long been
- 2 a leader in advancing reproductive rights and advocating for
- 3 access to affordable and comprehensive sexual and reproductive
- 4 health care without discrimination. However, gaps in coverage
- 5 and care still exist, and Hawaii benefits and protections have
- 6 not included equitable coverage for family planning and
- 7 infertility treatments. According to the Centers for Disease
- 8 Control and Prevention, about ten per cent of women, or six
- 9 million one hundred thousand women, in the United States ages
- 10 fifteen through forty-four have difficulty getting pregnant or
- 11 staying pregnant.
- In the United States, only seventeen states have passed
- 13 laws requiring insurers to either cover or offer coverage for
- 14 infertility diagnosis and treatment. These states include
- 15 Arkansas, California, Connecticut, Delaware, Hawaii, Illinois,
- 16 Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Montana, New Hampshire, New
- 17 Jersey, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, Texas, and West Virginia.

- 1 In Hawaii, pregnancy related coverage is included in accident
- 2 and health insurance policies as a one-time only benefit for
- 3 outpatient expenses arising from in vitro fertilization
- 4 procedures. Unfortunately, the procedure is not covered in the
- 5 first or second year of infertility but rather in the fifth year
- 6 of infertility, or the patient is required to provide
- 7 documentation that infertility is a result of a specified
- 8 medical condition.
- 9 The legislature further finds that access to sexual and
- 10 reproductive health care is critical for the health and
- 11 well-being of all families in Hawaii, particularly by helping
- 12 people remain healthy and plan their families in a way that is
- 13 appropriate for them. Ensuring that Hawaii's residents receive
- 14 comprehensive, quality, and culturally competent sexual and
- 15 reproductive health care is a prudent economic policy that will
- 16 improve the overall health of the State's communities.
- 17 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to ensure
- 18 comprehensive quality coverage for sexual reproductive health
- 19 care services, including family planning and infertility
- 20 treatments, for all Hawaii residents.

- 9 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Health Insurance; Oocyte Cryopreservation; In Vitro Fertilization

Description:

Requires oocyte cryopreservation to be covered by health insurance policies. Removes 1-time benefit limitation for in vitro fertilization. Reduces from 5 to 2 the number of years of infertility before becoming eligible for in vitro fertilization. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
