A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISABILITY HEALTH DISPARITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) The department of human services shall
2	submit to	the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
3	convening	of the regular session of 2023, a report focused on
4	the healt	n disparities experienced by individuals with
5	disabilit	ies in Hawaii. The report shall include:
6	(1)	A definition of Hawaii's disability population for
7		public health administration purposes, including the
8		health conditions, duration, and level of severity
9		required to qualify for disability status;
10	(2)	Population-level differences in Hawaii between
11		individuals with and without disabilities on health
12		indicators and social determinants of health,
13		including:
14		(A) Access to necessary health care;
15		(B) Access to preventive health care, including
16		wellness programs and emotional support services;

1	(C)	Health behaviors, including the percentage of
2		individuals who engage in physical activities or
3		smoke cigarettes;
4	(D)	Health status and outcomes, including the
5		percentage of individuals who are considered
6		obese or diagnosed with chronic diseases,
7		including diabetes, hypertension, and
8		cardiovascular diseases;
9	(E)	Emergency preparedness, including evacuation
10		planning and ability;
11	(F)	Health insurance coverage;
12	(G)	Social determinants of health and health
13		outcomes, including household income, employment
14		status, education level, access to health
15		information technology tools and systems, access
16		to transportation, and social and community
17		environment; and
18	(H)	Other indicators and determinants that contribute
19		to an individual's physical and mental health;

1	(3)	Factors contributing to the population-level	
2		differences, including economic and social	
3		disadvantages and discrimination;	
4	(4)	A determination of the population-level differences	
5		and contributing factors that are preventable or	
6		avoidable;	
7	(5)	Any other information that would assist the State in	
8		determining safe, equitable, and culturally	
9		appropriate public health actions that would improve	
10		health care and address the health disparities	
11		experienced by Hawaii's disability population; and	
12	(6)	Proposed legislation, including best practices for the	
13		State to reduce the health disparities experienced by	
14		Hawaii's disability population.	
15	(b)	For purposes of this Act, "health disparities" means	
16	population-level differences in health outcomes that are related		
17	to a history of social, economic, or environmental		
18	disadvantages, that are avoidable and not primarily caused by		
19	underlying health conditions that led to the disability.
