A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of cover
- 2 crops, green manure, and compost increases agricultural
- 3 productivity and aligns with the State's integrated
- 4 sustainability goals. Plants used for this purpose, including
- 5 grasses, legumes, and forbs, add nutrients to the soil, act as
- 6 windbreaks, assist with water retention, provide habitats for
- 7 beneficial insects, and help prevent soil erosion.
- 8 The legislature further finds that it is in the interest of
- 9 the State to incentivize the use of management practices that
- 10 enhance the quality and sustainability of Hawaii's agricultural
- 11 lands.
- 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish and
- 13 appropriate moneys for a cover crop reimbursement pilot program
- 14 to reimburse farming operations in the State for the costs of
- 15 acquiring cover crop seeds, green manure, or compost.
- 16 SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture shall
- 17 establish and implement a three-year cover crop reimbursement



- 1 pilot program to reimburse farming operations in the State for
- 2 the costs of acquiring cover crop seeds, green manure, or
- 3 compost.
- 4 (b) Each application for cost reimbursement shall be
- 5 submitted on a form furnished by the department of agriculture
- 6 and shall be accompanied by documentation of the costs of items
- 7 purchased, pursuant to subsection (c); provided that:
- 8 (1) The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the
- 9 State and its officers, agents, and employees from all
- 10 claims arising out of or resulting from the cover crop
- seeds, green manure, or compost purchased; and
- 12 (2) The department of agriculture may request that the
- 13 applicant provide additional information for the
- 14 purposes of verifying the volume of cover crop seeds,
- green manure, or compost purchased.
- 16 (c) Applications for reimbursement under the cover crop
- 17 reimbursement pilot program shall be filed for cover crop seeds,
- 18 green manure, and compost purchased within the fiscal year
- 19 immediately preceding the filing and shall be effective for
- 20 costs of the purchases incurred after June 30, 2022, and before
- 21 July 1, 2025. Each application shall include a certification

- 1 that the amount for which the applicant seeks reimbursement has
- 2 not been nor will be reimbursed by any other governmental cover
- 3 crop incentive program, including the United States Department
- 4 of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Service's
- 5 environmental quality incentives program and the conservation
- 6 stewardship program.
- 7 (d) If an application is approved, funds shall be
- 8 disbursed upon approval by the department of agriculture on an
- 9 annual basis to the farmer or rancher for up to seventy-five per
- 10 cent of the costs incurred for cover crop seeds, green manure,
- 11 or compost purchased after June 30, 2022, and before July 1,
- **12** 2025.
- (e) The department of agriculture shall convene a review
- 14 panel comprising knowledgeable representatives from the
- 15 department of agriculture, University of Hawaii at Manoa college
- 16 of tropical agriculture and human resources, and industry
- 17 organizations. The panel shall screen and rate applicants on
- 18 the quality and appropriate use of their cover crops and green
- 19 manure and their composting practices. The department shall
- 20 aggregate the total reimbursement applications pursuant to this
- 21 section and distribute the available moneys based on a ranking

- 1 scale as determined by the review panel; provided that a higher-
- 2 ranked applicant shall receive a higher rate of reimbursement
- 3 than a lower-ranked applicant.
- 4 (f) There is established within the department of
- 5 agriculture a cover crop reimbursement pilot program manager
- 6 position, which shall be a full-time temporary position exempt
- 7 from the requirements of chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised
- 8 Statutes. The cover crop reimbursement pilot program manager
- 9 shall receive a salary not exceeding \$50,000 per year. The
- 10 cover crop reimbursement pilot program manager shall possess a
- 11 requisite level of knowledge and expertise in the area of
- 12 program management necessary to carry out the duties of the
- 13 position. The cover crop reimbursement pilot program manager
- 14 shall:
- 15 (1) Facilitate the division and distribution of available
- 16 costs for reimbursement; and
- 17 (2) Manage the day-to-day coordination of the cover crop
- 18 reimbursement pilot program.
- 19 (g) Any action taken by the department of agriculture
- 20 pursuant to this section shall be exempt from the rulemaking
- 21 requirements of chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

- 1 (h) The department of agriculture shall submit an interim
- 2 report of its findings and recommendations relating to
- 3 activities conducted pursuant to this Act, including any
- 4 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
- 5 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2025 and a
- 6 final report no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 7 the regular session of 2026. The report shall include the
- 8 department's recommendation on whether the pilot program should
- 9 be extended, with or without modifications.
- 10 (i) As used in this section:
- "Compost" means a product of a composting process.
- 12 "Compostable materials" includes pre- and post-consumer
- 13 food waste, waste from animal food processing operations, green
- 14 waste, crop residues, and waste from vegetable food processing
- 15 operations and similar materials.
- "Composting process" means a process in which organic
- 17 compostable materials are biologically decomposed under
- 18 controlled conditions to produce a stable humus-like mulch or
- 19 soil amendment, and includes:
- 20 (1) The receipt of materials;
- 21 (2) Primary processing;

- 1 (3) Decomposition activities; and
- 2 (4) Final processing for sale and marketing.
- 3 "Cover crop" and "green manure" mean the plants listed in
- 4 the cover crop and green manure database maintained by the
- 5 University of Hawaii at Manoa college of tropical agriculture
- 6 and human resources, except bermuda grass and other invasive or
- 7 fast-growing grasses.
- 8 "Farming operation" has the same meaning as in section
- 9 165-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 10 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
- 13 the department of agriculture to establish, implement, and
- 14 administer a cover crop reimbursement pilot program; provided
- 15 that up to \$ may be used for the pilot program's
- 16 administrative costs.
- 17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 18 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Sustainable Agriculture; HDOA; Cover Crop Reimbursement Pilot Program; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes a cover crop reimbursement pilot program to provide up to 75% cost reimbursement to farming operations in the State for the acquisition of cover crop seeds, green manure, or compost. Requires the convening of a review panel to screen and rate applicants on the quality of their cover crop and green manure and composting practices. Establishes a cover crop reimbursement pilot program manager position within the Department of Agriculture to administer the program. Requires reports to the Legislature. Appropriates moneys. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
