A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that during challenging

2 economic times, it is necessary for the State to investigate and

3 employ digital technology and other innovative ways of

4 maintaining and improving state services and infrastructure,

5 ensure input by stakeholders, and ensure the prudent and

6 cost-effective expenditure of public moneys.

7 The legislature further finds that the state procurement

8 office is responsible for reviewing the solicitation, award, and

9 administration of contracts, advising government agencies on

procurement issues, and providing procurement training to the

State's decentralized procurement staff. The state procurement

12 office administers statewide, multi-agency contracts that take

advantage of the State's aggregated purchasing power to leverage

14 better pricing and value for the State and the counties. In

15 fiscal year 2018-2019, these contracts saved the State and its

16 political subdivisions approximately \$19,000,000 in goods and

17 services, plus savings in personnel, purchasing, and subject

18 matter expert hours.
