A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSFERABILITY OF MOORING PERMITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 200-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:		
3	"(d) The department shall not renew or issue a permit to a		
4	person who is not the owner of the vessel [which] that is moored		
5	or [which] that the person desires to moor in a state small boat		
6	harbor. No use permit may be transferred unless specifically		
7	provided by law.		
8	Any person possessing a mooring permit may transfer the		
9	mooring permit to a new vessel owner upon the sale of the		
10	mooring permittee's vessel to which the mooring permit applies,		
11	and the transferee may retain the mooring permit; provided that		
12	all of the following conditions are met:		
13	(1) The sale price of the vessel shall not take into		
14	account the value of the attendant mooring permit or		
15	any fees required by this subsection; provided further		
16	that if the department has reason to believe that the		

vessel is being sold for a price substantially greater

1		or less than fair market value, the department may	
2		require an appraisal of the vessel by a state-licensed	
3		appraiser at the expense of the vessel owner;	
4	(2)	The seller shall pay to the department a mooring	
5		permit transfer fee of \$150; and	
6	(3)	The seller shall comply with this chapter and chapter	
7		200A, and any administrative rules adopted thereunder.	
8	Nothing i	n this subsection shall be construed as allowing a	
9	person possessing a mooring permit to transfer the mooring		
10	permit without a corresponding sale of the vessel to which the		
11	mooring permit applies. Failure of any person to comply with		
12	this subsection when selling the person's vessel or transferring		
13	a mooring permit shall result in the automatic termination of		
14	the applicable mooring permit.		
15	Unless otherwise required by law or a court of competent		
16	jurisdiction, if a vessel is sold in accordance with this		
17	subsectio	n, the principal habitation permit applied to the	
18	vessel, i	f any, shall not transfer to the new vessel owner and	
19	shall aut	omatically terminate.	
20	Any	individual who is an owner of a vessel used for	
21	commercia	l purposes, including commercial fishing as a principal	

- 1 means of livelihood, and possesses a valid mooring permit or
- 2 commercial permit, or both, in accordance with the rules adopted
- 3 by the chairperson pursuant to chapter 91, may transfer
- 4 ownership of the vessel from personal ownership to corporate or
- 5 other business ownership without terminating the right to moor
- 6 or operate the vessel under the permit or permits. The existing
- 7 permit or permits shall be reissued in the name of the
- 8 transferee corporation or other business entity."
- 9 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
