## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII RESIDENT TUITION FEE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that facilitating
2	postsecondary education and training for all interested high
3	school graduates serves the State's interest and is a matter of
4	statewide concern. These postsecondary option assist graduate
5	by preparing them for jobs and career pathways that typically
6	pay higher wages, which enables them to achieve their
7	educational and career goals and afford the State's high cost of
8	living. Increased enrollment and completion of postsecondary
9	education and training also will increase the State's human
10	capital.
11	The University of Hawaii is amending its administrative
12	rules to streamline the enrollment process for all applicants
13	into the University of Hawaii system; however, the current
14	statutory requirements regarding residency for tuition purposes
15	pose challenges for some local graduates. Specifically,
16	students experiencing homelessness have difficulty providing
17	evidence of bona fide residency, and students who have complex

- 1 family situations may be incorrectly considered nonresidents.
- 2 The legislature further finds that recognizing local high school
- 3 graduates and those who complete high school equivalencies
- 4 locally as residents to qualify for resident tuition fees would
- 5 facilitate the enrollment of these students at one of the
- 6 University of Hawaii's campuses.
- 7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to simplify the
- 8 residency determination for the State's high school students and
- 9 graduates to enroll in postsecondary education and training at
- 10 the University of Hawaii by considering high school seniors and
- 11 recent high school graduates to be residents for tuition
- 12 purposes.
- SECTION 2. Section 304A-402, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] §304A-402[+] Residence for tuition purposes; basic
- 16 rule. The board of regents shall adopt the necessary rules
- 17 defining residence for tuition purposes herein; provided that
- 18 the basic rule shall be that a student shall qualify for the
- 19 resident tuition fee only if the following criteria are met:

11		claimed as a dependent for tax purposes for at
12		least twelve months next preceding the student's
13		first day of officially scheduled instruction for
14		any semester or term in which the student is
15		enrolling at the particular college or campus by
16		the student's parents or guardians who are
17		nonresidents of the State; provided that this
18		provision shall not apply in cases where the
19		parent claiming the student as a dependent is
20		entitled to do so under a child support order or
21		agreement issued or entered into in conjunction

1			with a divorce proceeding or legal separation
2			agreement and the other parent and the student
3			meet the criteria set forth in [paragraph (1).]
4			subparagraph (A);
5	(2)	In t	he case of a minor student:
6		(A)	The student's parents or guardians have been a
7			bona fide resident of this State for at least
8			twelve consecutive months next preceding the
9			student's first day of officially scheduled
10			instruction for any semester or term in which the
11			student is enrolling at the particular college or
12			campus; and
13		(B)	The minor student has not been claimed as a
14			dependent for tax purposes for at least twelve
15			months next preceding the student's first day of
16			officially scheduled instruction for any semester
17			or term in which the student is enrolling at the
18			particular college or campus by the student's
19			parents or guardians who are nonresidents of the
20			State; provided that this provision shall not
21			apply in cases where the parent claiming the

1		student as a dependent is entitled to do so under
2		a child support order or agreement issued or
3		entered into in conjunction with a divorce
4		proceeding or legal separation agreement and the
5		other parent and the student meet the criteria
6		set forth in subparagraph (A);
7	(3)	The adult or minor student is enrolled in a high
8		school in the State for at least twelve consecutive
9		months preceding the student's first day of officially
10		scheduled instruction at the particular college or
11		campus; or
12	(4)	The adult or minor student received a high school
13		diploma or equivalent in the State within twelve
14		months preceding the student's first day of officially
15		scheduled instruction at the particular college or
16		campus."
17	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
