A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUNTING GUIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that guided hunting tours
2	help manage game populations, provide a living wage for the
3	hunting guides, and help drive Hawaii's economy. As the
4	popularity of guided hunting tours have increased, some hunting
5	guides have guided their clients to hunt on private lands
6	without the permission of landowners. At times, landowners have
7	alarmingly witnessed unknown persons walking on their land with
8	guns or other weapons. While current law requires hunters to
9	obtain permission to hunt on private land, hunting guides often
10	simply lie and say they have oral permission, leading to
11	disagreements, allegations of trespassing, and damage to the
12	guided hunting tour industry from clients who believed they were
13	allowed to hunt on the private land.
14	The purpose of this Act is to require that hunting guides:
15	(1) Obtain written permission from private landowners
16	before taking their clients to hunt on private lands;
17	and

1	(2) Provide a copy of the written permission documents to
2	the department of land and natural resources.
3	SECTION 2. Section 183D-25.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
5	"(c) Hunting guides shall provide an annual report to the
6	department of their guide activities that shall include [the]:
7	(1) The number of clients served [and the];
8	(2) The clients' residency status[-];
9	(3) The location of each guided hunt;
10	(4) For each guided hunt that occurred on private land, a
11	copy of the written permission from the owner or duly
12	appointed agent of the land or premises effective at
13	the time of the guided hunt that was issued to the
14	hunting guide pursuant to section 183D-26(b); and
15	(5) Other information as required by the department.
16	The reports shall be submitted within thirty days after the
17	expiration of the hunting guide license issued pursuant to this
18	section. The failure to submit an annual report within the tim
19	specified shall be grounds for the revocation and nonrenewal of
20	the hunting guide license."

This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 8 9 begun before its effective date. 10 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 12 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050; 13 provided that the amendments made by section 2 shall apply to all annual reports filed for the July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, 14

Department of Land and Natural Resources; Hunting Guides; Private Land; Written Permission

Description:

Requires that hunting guides obtain written permission from private landowners or other appropriate person before taking their clients to hunt on those private lands. Requires hunting guides to provide copies of those written permission documents to the Department of Land and Natural Resources. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)
