A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT RECORDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds it to be in the best				
2	interest of the State and the public to ensure that governmental				
3	records are managed in as cost- and space-effective means as				
4	possible. Records must be stored and accessible for the entire				
5	period of their legal retention schedule and destroyed at the				
6	expiration of their retention period. Site surveys have				
7	determined that storing inactive records within the office				
8	spaces allotted to state agencies is neither a good use of				
9	public funds nor the agencies' office spaces. Governmental				
10	records are most efficiently and effectively managed when they				
11	are transferred to mass storage facilities once their immediate				
12	business needs have been satisfied.				
13	The legislature further finds that the state archives is				
14	the only agency in the State that has been legislatively tasked				
15	with the duty to collect, preserve, arrange, describe, and				
16	inventory records of enduring value. The state archives also				

provides records management consultative services to all three

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- 1 branches of government and cost-efficient mass storage of both
- 2 records of enduring value and non-permanent inactive records of
- 3 government. The state archives manages the public archives in
- 4 the Kekauluohi building as a state-of-the-art archival facility
- 5 with security, environmental controls, gas fire suppression, and
- 6 professional staff to ensure the long-term preservation of and
- 7 access to approximately fourteen thousand cubic feet of records
- 8 of enduring value. The state archives manages the state records
- 9 center at Mapunapuna for the cost-efficient storage and
- 10 destruction of up to fifty-nine thousand cubic feet of inactive
- 11 non-permanent records. Because the state records center can
- 12 store inactive non-permanent records at approximately one-fifth
- 13 the cost of storing those same records in state office
- 14 buildings, it is of greatest benefit to the State to maximize
- 15 the storage of inactive non-permanent records at the state
- 16 records center and ensure the long-term preservation of records
- 17 of enduring value at the public archives.
- 18 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 19 (1) Amend existing law to empower the comptroller to
- 20 mandate the transfer of governmental records to the
- 21 state records center; and

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1	(2) Appropriate funds to the state archives to fund
2	positions to assist agencies in the identification and
3	transfer of governmental records of enduring value to
4	the public archives, and operating costs and equipment
5	to administer the storage of inactive non-permanent
6	records at the state records center.
7	SECTION 2. Section 94-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"§94-3 Disposal of government records generally. (a)
10	Each public officer, except public officers of the judiciary and
11	the legislative branch of government, having the care and
12	custody of any government records shall submit to the state
13	comptroller a list of records for disposition authorization,
14	which shall include the name of the office, department, or
15	bureau, the description of the records for disposal, the
16	inclusive dates of the records, and the retention period.
17	(b) The comptroller shall determine the disposition of the
18	records[; stating] and shall state whether the records should be
19	[retained]:
20	(1) Retained by the office, department, or bureau; [be
2.1	transferred]

1	(2)	<u>Transferred</u> to the state archives, <u>state records</u>		
2		<pre>center, or other agency[;], and the time period at</pre>		
3		which the records shall be transferred as directed; or	r

6	(c)	The comptroller shall have full power of disposal of		
7	all recor	ds submitted for this purpose. The disposition		
8	authorization of all records, including lists submitted by the			
9	public officers, and the action taken by the comptroller, shall			
10	be kept on proper forms, specified by the comptroller, one copy			
11	of which shall be filed in the office, department, or bureau			
12	where the records originated, one copy shall be filed in the			
13	office of the attorney general, and the original shall be filed			
14	in the state archives.			
15	[-(b)] (d) If requested, the comptroller shall provide		
16	assistanc	e to the legislative branch of government or any agenc	У	
17	or entity	therein in establishing policies relating to the		
18	disposal	of government records."		
19	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general			
20	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
21	much ther	enf as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for		

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- 1 the operating costs and equipment necessary to administer the
- 2 state records center pursuant to chapter 94, Hawaii Revised
- 3 Statutes; provided that \$ of the moneys appropriated
- 4 pursuant to this Act shall be used to fund the salary of
- full-time equivalent (FTE) positions
- 6 within the state archives to assist agencies in the
- 7 identification and transfer of certain government records to the
- 8 state archives.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 10 enterprise technology services for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.

Report Title:

Government Records; Office of Enterprise Technology Services; Hawaii State Archives; State Records Center; Comptroller; Appropriations

Description:

Allows the comptroller to direct the transfer of records to the state records center and determine the time period at which the records should be transferred. Appropriates funds to the office of enterprise technology services for operating costs and equipment for the state records center and for positions within the state archives. Effective 7/1/2112.
