A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that large organizations
- 2 like the State of Hawaii could benefit by consolidating
- 3 information technology resources to gain economies of scale and
- 4 provide for a more efficient and secure use of technology and
- 5 information management. The consolidation of technology sources
- 6 will also help to ensure that the State remains in compliance
- 7 with growing regulatory requirements for accessibility,
- 8 information storage, data sharing, and security, especially in
- 9 light of recent high-profile attacks of government computer
- 10 systems by hackers.
- 11 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 12 working group to develop a plan for the phased consolidation of
- 13 information technology services and staff within executive
- 14 branch agencies in a five-year timespan, excluding the
- 15 department of education, Hawaii health systems corporation, and
- 16 university of Hawaii.

l 1	(1)	The state chief information officer, who shall serve

16	(3)	Any other person that the chief administrative officer
17		wishes to invite to serve on the working group.
18	(c)	The working group shall be attached to the department

20	services	shall provide administrative support to the working

(d)	No later than twenty days prior to the convening of			
the regul	ar session of 2023, the working group shall submit to			
the legis	lature a report of its findings and recommendations,			
including:				
(1)	The plan for a phased consolidation of state

	subsection (a)(1), including a detailed five-year			
	phase-in schedule;			
(2)	Recommendations to attract high quality information

(e)	The working group shall dissolve on June 30, 2023.

Description:

Establishes a technology services consolidation working group, which shall develop a plan for the phased consolidation of all state executive branch information technology services and staff within five years, except those of the Department of Education, Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, and University of Hawaii, under the Office of Enterprise Technology Services. Requires the working group to recommend ways to attract high quality information technology professionals to the State.
