A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that large organizations
- 2 like the State of Hawaii could benefit from consolidating
- 3 information technology resources to gain economies of scale and
- 4 provide for a more efficient and secure use of technology and
- 5 information management. The consolidation of technology sources
- 6 will also help to ensure that the State remains in compliance
- 7 with growing regulatory requirements for accessibility,
- 8 information storage, data sharing, and security, especially in
- 9 light of recent high-profile attacks on government computer
- 10 systems by hackers.
- 11 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 12 working group to develop a plan for the phased consolidation of
- 13 information technology services and staff within executive
- 14 branch agencies in a five-year timespan, excluding the
- 15 department of education, Hawaii health systems corporation,
- 16 University of Hawaii, and the office of Hawaiian affairs.

14		(C)	Proposed information technology facility,								
15			personnel, and operational infrastructure needs								
16			of the consolidated information technology								
17			agency, with projections on future integration								
18			needs as additional agency information technology								
19			staff and services are added;								
20		(D)	Recommendations to enable the office of								
21			enterprise technology services to provide expert								

1		support to all state agencies regarding							
2		information technology activities in order to							
3		meet the needs of the agencies and the public;

5		(E) Recommendations to ensure that agency services							
6		are not interrupted during the consolidation; and							
7	(2)	Make recommendations to attract high quality							
8		information technology professionals to the State,							
9		including the use of internships, and assessing the							
10		feasibility of exempting certain positions from the							
11		requirements of chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised							
12		Statutes.							
13	(b)	Members of the working group shall include:							
14	(1)	The state chief information officer, who shall serve							
15		as chairperson;							
16	(2)	The head of each principal executive branch department							
17		or that person's designee, except the department of							
18		education, Hawaii health systems corporation,							
19		University of Hawaii, and office of Hawaiian affairs;

- 3 (c) The working group shall be attached to the department
- 4 of accounting and general services. The office of enterprise
- 5 technology services shall provide administrative support to the
- 6 working group.
- 7 (d) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 8 the regular session of 2023, the working group shall submit to
- 9 the legislature a report of its findings and recommendations,
- 10 including:
- 11 (1) The plan for a phased consolidation of state

 12 information technology services developed pursuant to

 13 subsection (a)(1), including a detailed five-year

 14 phase-in schedule;
- 15 (2) Recommendations to attract high quality information 16 technology professionals to the State; and
- 17 (3) Any proposed legislation.
- 18 (e) The working group shall dissolve on June 30, 2023.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Description:

Establishes a technology services consolidation working group, which shall develop a plan for the phased consolidation of all state executive branch information technology services and staff within 5 years, except those of the Department of Education, Hawaii Health Systems Corporation, University of Hawaii, and Office of Hawaiian Affairs, under the Office of Enterprise Technology Services. Requires the working group to recommend ways to attract high quality information technology professionals to the State. Dissolves the working group on 6/30/2023. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
