A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC ACCESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii state
- 2 capitol is a public building rich with history and significance.
- Completed in 1969, the capitol building was designed as a modern 3
- 4 and functional place of democracy imbued with deep meaning,
- 5 beauty, and dignity. Meant to recall the birth of the islands
- 6 from the sea, the unique design of the building offers insight
- 7 into the State's singular history, shared values, and public
- 8 priorities.
- 9 The legislature further finds that maintaining
- 10 accessibility to the capitol building and its history for
- 11 Hawaii's residents, students, and visitors is a meaningful
- 12 public service that provides visitors to the building with a
- 13 profound appreciation for the State and the democratic process.
- 14 The legislature also finds that providing public tours of the
- 15 capitol building resonates with and perpetuates the "aloha
- 16 spirit", as that term is defined by section 5-7.5, Hawaii
- 17 Revised Statutes.

| 16 | and regular updating of a virtual tour website; and |
| 17 | (2) In addition to in-person, guided tours, walking tours |
| 18 | shall include availability to the public of |
| 19 | information for self-guided tours in the form of paper |
| 20 | brochures and a website. |
