### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FERTILITY PRESERVATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require Hawaii
- 2 insurance companies to include, as a benefit, fertility
- 3 preservation procedures for men and women of reproductive age
- 4 who have been diagnosed with cancer and whose cancer treatment
- 5 may adversely affect their fertility.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding a new section to article 10A to be
- 8 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 9 "§431:10A- Fertility preservation procedure coverage.
- 10 (a) Each policy of accident and health or sickness insurance
- 11 providing coverage for health care, except for policies that
- 12 provide coverage only for specified diseases or other limited
- 13 benefit coverage, shall provide coverage for standard fertility
- 14 preservation services; provided that:
- 15 (1) The insured is diagnosed with a cancer that may or the
- treatment of which may adversely affect the fertility
- of the insured; and



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1	(2) The standard fertility preservation services are
2	deemed reasonably necessary for the insured.
3	(b) For the purposes of this section, "standard fertility
4	preservation services" means procedures consistent with
5	established medical practices and professional guidelines
6	published by the American Society for Reproductive Medicine, the
7	American Society of Clinical Oncology, or as defined by the
8	department of health. "Standard fertility preservation
9	services" shall include the storage of sperm or oocytes for one
10	year."
11	SECTION 3. Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by adding a new section to part VI of article 1 to be
13	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
14	*§432:1- Fertility preservation procedure coverage.
15	(a) All individual and group hospital and medical service
16	contracts providing health care coverage shall provide coverage
17	for standard fertility preservation services; provided that:
18	(1) The insured is diagnosed with a cancer that may or the
19	treatment of which may adversely affect the fertility
20	of the insured; and

- 14 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, each
- 15 policy, contract, plan, or agreement issued in the State after
- 16 January 1, 1995, by health maintenance organizations pursuant to
- 17 this chapter, shall include benefits provided in sections
- 18 431:10-212, 431:10A-115, 431:10A-115.5, 431:10A-116,
- 19 431:10A-116.2, 431:10A-116.5, 431:10A-116.6, 431:10A-119,
- 20 431:10A-120, 431:10A-121, 431:10A-122, 431:10A-125, 431:10A-126,

- 1 431:10A-132, 431:10A-133, 431:10A-140, [and] 431:10A-134, and
- 2 431:10A- , and chapter 431M."
- 3 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
