A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE ENERGY OFFICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 76-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) The civil service to which this chapter applies shall

4 comprise all positions in the State now existing or hereafter

5 established and embrace all personal services performed for the

State, except the following:

- 7 (1) Commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Hawaii
 8 National Guard as such, and positions in the Hawaii
 9 National Guard that are required by state or federal
 10 laws or regulations or orders of the National Guard to
- 11 be filled from those commissioned or enlisted

personnel;

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13 (2) Positions filled by persons employed by contract where

14 the director of human resources development has

15 certified that the service is special or unique or is

essential to the public interest and that, because of

17 circumstances surrounding its fulfillment, personnel

1		to perform the service cannot be obtained through
2		normal civil service recruitment procedures. Any
3		[such] contract may be for any period not exceeding
4		one year;
5	(3)	Positions that must be filled without delay to comply
6		with a court order or decree if the director
7		determines that recruitment through normal recruitment
8		civil service procedures would result in delay or
9		noncompliance, such as the Felix-Cayetano consent
10		decree;
11	(4)	Positions filled by the legislature or by either house
12		or any committee thereof;
13	(5)	Employees in the office of the governor and office of
14		the lieutenant governor, and household employees at
15		Washington Place;
16	(6)	Positions filled by popular vote;
17	(7)	Department heads, officers, and members of any board,
18		commission, or other state agency whose appointments
19		are made by the governor or are required by law to be
20		confirmed by the senate;

1	(8)	Judges, referees, receivers, masters, jurors, notaries
2		public, land court examiners, court commissioners, and
3		attorneys appointed by a state court for a special
4		temporary service;

One bailiff for the chief justice of the supreme court
who shall have the powers and duties of a court
officer and bailiff under section 606-14; one
secretary or clerk for each justice of the supreme
court, each judge of the intermediate appellate court,
and each judge of the circuit court; one secretary for
the judicial council; one deputy administrative
director of the courts; three law clerks for the chief
justice of the supreme court, two law clerks for each
associate justice of the supreme court and each judge
of the intermediate appellate court, one law clerk for
each judge of the circuit court, two additional law
clerks for the civil administrative judge of the
circuit court of the first circuit, two additional law
clerks for the criminal administrative judge of the

14		the attorney general, one secretary for the
15		administrative services manager, an administrator and
16		any support staff for the criminal and juvenile
17		justice resources coordination functions, and law
18		clerks;
19	(11)	(A) Teachers, principals, vice-principals, complex
20		area superintendents, deputy and assistant
21		superintendents, other certificated personnel,

1		not more than twenty noncertificated
2		administrative, professional, and technical
3		personnel not engaged in instructional work;
4	(B)	Effective July 1, 2003, teaching assistants,
5		educational assistants, bilingual/bicultural
6		school-home assistants, school psychologists,
7		psychological examiners, speech pathologists,
8		athletic health care trainers, alternative school
9		work study assistants, alternative school
10		educational/supportive services specialists,
11		alternative school project coordinators, and
12		communications aides in the department of
13		education;
14	(C)	The special assistant to the state librarian and
15		one secretary for the special assistant to the
16		state librarian; and
17	(D)	Members of the faculty of the University of
18		Hawaii, including research workers, extension
19		agents, personnel engaged in instructional work,
20		and administrative, professional, and technical
21		personnel of the university;

1	(12)	Empl	oyees engaged in special, research, or
2		demo	enstration projects approved by the governor;
3	(13)	(A)	Positions filled by inmates, patients of state
4			institutions, persons with severe physical or
5			mental disabilities participating in the work
6			experience training programs;
7		(B)	Positions filled with students in accordance with
8			guidelines for established state employment
9			programs; and
10		(C)	Positions that provide work experience training
11			or temporary public service employment that are
12			filled by persons entering the workforce or
13			persons transitioning into other careers under
14			programs such as the federal Workforce Investment
15			Act of 1998, as amended, or the Senior Community
16			Service Employment Program of the Employment and
17			Training Administration of the United States
18			Department of Labor, or under other similar state
19			programs;
20	(14)	A cu	stodian or guide at Iolani Palace, the Royal
21		Maus	soleum, and Hulihee Palace;

1	(15)	Positions lilied by persons employed on a ree,
2		contract, or piecework basis, who may lawfully perform
3		their duties concurrently with their private business
4		or profession or other private employment and whose
5		duties require only a portion of their time, if it is
6		impracticable to ascertain or anticipate the portion
7		of time to be devoted to the service of the State;
8	(16)	Positions of first deputies or first assistants of
9		each department head appointed under or in the manner
10		provided in section 6, article V, of the Hawaii State
11		Constitution; three additional deputies or assistants
12		either in charge of the highways, harbors, and
13		airports divisions or other functions within the
14		department of transportation as may be assigned by the
15		director of transportation, with the approval of the
16		governor; four additional deputies in the department
17		of health, each in charge of one of the following:
18		behavioral health, environmental health, hospitals,
19		and health resources administration, including other
20		functions within the department as may be assigned by
21		the director of health, with the approval of the

1		governor; an administrative assistant to the state
2		librarian; and an administrative assistant to the
3		superintendent of education;
4	(17)	Positions specifically exempted from this part by any
5		other law; provided that:
6		(A) Any exemption created after July 1, 2014, shall
7		expire three years after its enactment unless
8		affirmatively extended by an act of the
9		legislature; and
10		(B) All of the positions defined by paragraph (9)
11		shall be included in the position classification
12		plan;
13	(18)	Positions in the state foster grandparent program and
14		positions for temporary employment of senior citizens
15		in occupations in which there is a severe personnel
16		shortage or in special projects;
17	(19)	Household employees at the official residence of the
18		president of the University of Hawaii;
19	(20)	Employees in the department of education engaged in
20		the supervision of students during meal periods in the
2.1		distribution collection and counting of meal

1		tickets, and in the cleaning of classrooms after
2		school hours on a less than half-time basis;
3	(21)	Employees hired under the tenant hire program of the
4		Hawaii public housing authority; provided that not
5		more than twenty-six per cent of the authority's
6		workforce in any housing project maintained or
7		operated by the authority shall be hired under the
8		tenant hire program;
9	(22)	Positions of the federally funded expanded food and
10		nutrition program of the University of Hawaii that
11		require the hiring of nutrition program assistants who
12		live in the areas they serve;
13	(23)	Positions filled by persons with severe disabilities
14		who are certified by the state vocational
15		rehabilitation office that they are able to perform
16		safely the duties of the positions;
17	(24)	The sheriff;
18	(25)	A gender and other fairness coordinator hired by the
19		judiciary;
20	(26)	Positions in the Hawaii National Guard youth and adult
21		education programs:

1	(27)	In the state energy office (in the department of
2		business, economic development, and tourism], all
3		energy program managers, energy program specialists,
4		energy program assistants, and energy analysts;
5	(28)	Administrative appeals hearing officers in the
6		department of human services;
7	(29)	In the Med-QUEST division of the department of human
8		services, the division administrator, finance officer,
9		health care services branch administrator, medical
10		director, and clinical standards administrator;
11	(30)	In the director's office of the department of human
12		services, the enterprise officer, information security
13		and privacy compliance officer, security and privacy
14		compliance engineer, and security and privacy
15		compliance analyst;
16	(31)	The Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services
17		coordinator in the executive office on aging;
18	(32)	In the Hawaii emergency management agency, the
19		executive officer, public information officer, civil
20		defense administrative officer, branch chiefs, and
21		emergency operations center state warning point

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              personnel; provided that, for state warning point
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              personnel, the director shall determine that
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              recruitment through normal civil service recruitment
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              procedures would result in delay or noncompliance; and
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        (33) The executive director and seven full-time
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              administrative positions of the school facilities
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              authority.
         The director shall determine the applicability of this
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    section to specific positions.
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         Nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the civil
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    service status of any incumbent as it existed on July 1, 1955."
         SECTION 2. Section 107-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
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         "(a) There is established a state building code council.
    The council shall be placed within the department of accounting
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    and general services for administrative purposes only. The
    council shall consist of eleven voting members and one nonvoting
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    member, who shall be the comptroller or the comptroller's
    designee. The council members shall serve four-year terms.
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    voting members shall include:
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1	(1)	One county building official from each of the four
2		counties appointed by the mayor;
3	(2)	One member representing the state fire council;
4	(3)	One member representing the department of labor and
5		industrial relations who has significant experience in
6		elevator safety;
7	(4)	One member representing the state energy office [of
8		the department of business, economic development, and
9		tourism];
10	(5)	One member representing the Structural Engineers
11		Association of Hawaii;
12	(6)	One member representing the American Institute of
13		Architects, Hawaii State Council;
14	(7)	One member representing the Building Industry
15		Association of Hawaii or the General Contractors
16		Association of Hawaii, who has significant experience
17		with building codes, with alternating four-year terms
18		between the two organizations and the first four-year
19		term to be served by the Building Industry Association
20		of Hawaii; and

1 (8) One member representing the Subcontractors' Association of Hawaii who has significant experience 2 3 with building codes." SECTION 3. Section 196-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 6 "(c) The [director of business, economic development, and tourism] chairperson of the board of land and natural resources 7 may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to impose and collect 8 9 fees to cover the costs of administering variances under this section. The fees, if any, shall be deposited into the energy 10 security special fund established under section 201-12.8." 11 SECTION 4. Chapter 196, part V, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 12 13 is amended by amending its title to read as follows: "[+] PART V.[+] HAWAII STATE ENERGY OFFICE" 14 SECTION 5. Section 196-71, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 16 amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as 17 follows: "[+] §196-71[+] Hawaii state energy office; established. 18 (a) There is established the Hawaii state energy office, which 19

shall be a public body politic and an instrumentality and agency

of the State. The office shall be [placed within the department

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- 1 of business, economic development, and tourism for
- 2 administrative purposes, pursuant to section 26-35.]
- 3 administratively attached to the department of land and natural
- 4 resources. The purpose of the Hawaii state energy office shall
- 5 be to promote energy efficiency, renewable energy, and clean
- 6 transportation to help achieve a resilient clean energy
- 7 economy."
- 8 SECTION 6. Section 201-12.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 10 "(c) The [department of business, economic development,
- 11 and tourism] Hawaii state energy office shall submit a report to
- 12 the legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the
- 13 convening of each regular session, on the status and progress of
- 14 existing programs and activities and the status of new programs
- 15 and activities funded by the energy security special fund. The
- 16 report shall also include:
- 17 (1) The spending plan of the energy security special fund;
- 18 (2) All expenditures of energy security special fund
- moneys; and
- 20 (3) The targeted markets of the expenditures, including
- 21 the reason for selecting those markets; the persons to

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              be served; and the specific objectives of the
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              expenditures, including measurable outcomes."
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         SECTION 7. Section 304A-1892, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
    amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
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               The institute shall establish an advisory council of
    seven members, appointed by the president from a list of
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    nominees submitted by the director of the institute and the
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    chief energy officer of the Hawaii state energy office [of the
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    department of business, economic development, and tourism].
    members of the advisory council shall be from the general
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    public, the energy industry, technology providers, state
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    agencies whose primary functions relate to energy planning and
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    policy analyses, and environmental groups, or other relevant
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    stakeholder representatives as recommended by the director of
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    the institute and the chief energy officer of the Hawaii state
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    energy office. Members shall be selected on the basis of their
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    proven expertise and interest in the field of renewable energy.
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    The director of the institute and the chief energy officer of
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    the Hawaii state energy office shall serve as ex officio \left[\frac{1}{2}\right]
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    nonvoting members of the advisory council."
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- 1 SECTION 8. (a) The Hawaii state energy office shall be
- 2 transferred from the department of business, economic
- 3 development, and tourism and shall be administratively attached
- 4 to the department of land and natural resources.
- 5 (b) All rights, powers, functions, and duties of the
- 6 department of business, economic development, and tourism
- 7 relating to the Hawaii state energy office are transferred to
- 8 the department of land and natural resources.
- 9 All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose
- 10 functions are transferred to the department of land and natural
- 11 resources by this Act shall retain their civil service status,
- 12 whether permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred
- 13 without loss of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by
- 14 applicable collective bargaining agreements), retention points,
- 15 prior service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits
- 16 previously earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges,
- 17 in accordance with state personnel laws and this Act; provided
- 18 that the employees possess the minimum qualifications and public
- 19 employment requirements for the class or position to which
- 20 transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that

- 1 subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to applicable
- 2 civil service and compensation laws.
- 3 Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil
- 4 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may
- 5 retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed
- 6 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An
- 7 exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer
- 8 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits
- 9 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a
- 10 consequence of this Act; provided that the employees possess
- 11 legal and public employment requirements for the position to
- 12 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further
- 13 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to
- 14 applicable employment and compensation laws. The director of
- 15 land and natural resources may prescribe the duties and
- 16 qualifications of these employees and fix their salaries without
- 17 regard to chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- (c) All appropriations, records, equipment, machines,
- 19 files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, maps, and
- 20 other personal property heretofore made, used, acquired, or held
- 21 by the department of business, economic development, and tourism

- 1 for the Hawaii state energy office shall be transferred to the
- 2 department of land and natural resources with the functions to
- 3 which they relate.
- 4 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
