## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSIENT VACATION UNITS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 2 adding a new chapter to title 26 to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 TRANSIENT VACATION UNITS 6 -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the 7 context otherwise requires: 8 "Compensation" includes monetary payment, services, or 9 labor of transient occupants. 10 "County" means the county in which a dwelling unit is 11 located. "Dwelling unit" means a structure, or part of a structure,
- 12
- which is used as a home, residence, sleeping place, or lodging 13
- 14 by one person or by two or more persons maintaining a common
- 15 household or group, to the exclusion of all others.
- 16 "Transient vacation unit" means a dwelling unit that is
- 17 advertised, solicited, offered, or provided, or a combination of



- 1 any of the foregoing, for compensation to transient occupants
- 2 for fewer than thirty days.
- 3 § -2 Citizen suits. (a) After June 30, 2022, any
- 4 person may commence a civil action on that person's own behalf
- 5 against any owner of a dwelling unit if the owner:
- 6 (1) Is not authorized by the county to provide the
- 7 dwelling unit as a transient vacation unit; and
- **8** (2) Advertises, solicits, offers, or provides to any
- 9 person the dwelling unit as a transient vacation unit.
- 10 (b) The district court that is located in the county shall
- 11 have jurisdiction to:
- 12 (1) Enjoin the owner of the dwelling unit from providing
- the dwelling unit as a transient vacation unit;
- 14 (2) Order the owner to pay to the plaintiff damages not to
- exceed \$10,000, plus reasonable attorney fees; and
- 16 (3) Order the plaintiff to pay to the owner reasonable
- attorney fees in any action under this chapter where
- 18 the court determines that the claim was fraudulent or
- frivolous.

1	(c) No action may be commenced before days
2	after the plaintiff has given notice of the violation to the
3	owner.
4	(d) Parties may submit admissible evidence relating to the
5	alleged unauthorized activity, including photographic and
6	videographic evidence.
7	(e) Nothing in this section shall restrict any right that
8	any person may have under any constitutional provision, statute,
9	or common law to seek enforcement of any other applicable law or
10	to seek any other relief."
11	SECTION 2. Chapter 604, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
13	and to read as follows:
14	"§604- Jurisdiction of district courts; transient
15	vacation units; citizen suits. Jurisdiction is conferred upon
16	the district courts to try all cases specified in section -2
17	relating to unauthorized transient vacation units."
18	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that

matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were

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begun before its effective date.

- 1 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 2 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

## Report Title:

Transient Vacation Units; Rentals; Counties; Private Civil Suits

## Description:

Authorizes any person to commence a civil action in district court on that person's own behalf against any owner of a dwelling unit if the owner advertises, solicits, offers, or provides the dwelling unit as a transient vacation unit and the owner is not authorized by the applicable county to provide the unit as a transient vacation unit. Authorizes the court to order a plaintiff to pay reasonable attorney fees when it determines that a claim is fraudulent or frivolous. (SD1)

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
