## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ECONOMY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, in light of the
- 2 State's ongoing recovery from the coronavirus disease 2019
- 3 pandemic, the State must improve its economic coordination and
- 4 focus its efforts to meet specific state goals in the areas of
- 5 economic disaster mitigation and economic diversification.
- 6 This Act establishes a policy matrix that will ensure
- 7 economic success and meet the State's strategic economic
- 8 diversification goals to help meet this need. The legislature
- 9 finds that the implementation of this matrix will not require a
- 10 significant additional investment in overhead resources but will
- 11 require funds for specific programs that are identified
- 12 collaboratively by the legislature and department of business,
- 13 economic development, and tourism. The implementation will also
- 14 require the establishment of specific goals and reports to the
- 15 legislature that assess the effectiveness of the projects in
- 16 meeting those goals.

1	The legislature finds that through this Act, the department							
2	of business, economic development, and tourism will serve as a							
3	facilitative catalyst for the State, counties, businesses,							
4	investors, labor organizations, and communities and will help to

8	legislature finds that this Act will serve as a model for the

11	The purpose of this Act is to promote economic recovery and							
12	diversification by:							
13	(1) Establishing state goals for economic disaster							
14	mitigation and economic diversification;							
15	(2) Appropriating funds to the department of business,							
16	economic development, and tourism to implement							
17	specific projects that address those goals; and							
18	(3) Requiring the department of business, economic							
19	development, and tourism to submit annual reports to							
20	the legislature that summarize:

5		project's effectiveness in achieving state goals;

9	SECTION 2. (a) The legislature declares that the projects

4	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
5	business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
6	this Act.
7	SECTION 4. The appropriation made for projects authorized
8	by section 3 of this Act shall not lapse at the end of the
9	fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is made; provided
10	that all moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as of
11	June 30, 2024, shall lapse as of that date.
12	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to
15	fund two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions at the Hawaii
16	center for advanced transportation technologies; provided that
17	should federal funds or funding from other private or public
18	sources for these positions become available, the sum
19	appropriated by this section shall be decreased by the amount of
20	the funds secured from other sources.

DBEDT; Economic Disaster Mitigation; Economic Diversification; Hawaii Center for Advanced Transportation Technologies; Appropriation

#### Description:

Establishes a public policy framework that addresses state goals in the areas of economic disaster mitigation and economic diversification. Appropriates funds to DBEDT to implement specific projects that address those goals. Requires DBEDT to submit annual reports to the legislature summarizing project outcomes.
