A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that procurement
2	activities throughout the State may not be consistently
3	compliant with chapters 103D (the Hawaii Public Procurement
4	Code) and 103F (relating to purchases of health and human
5	services), Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the administrative rules
6	adopted pursuant to those chapters. Many purchasers conduct
7	procurement activities as part of their "other duties as
8	assigned" and have minimal training and experience in public
9	procurement. This can lead to mistakes resulting in increased
10	costs to the government.
11	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
12	(1) Establish a working group to develop a plan for the
13	phased in consolidation of procurement services and
14	staff within executive branch agencies within a five-
15	year timespan, excluding the department of education,
16	Hawaii health systems corporation, University of

Hawaii, and office of Hawaiian affairs;

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1	(2)	Requ	ire the working group to make recommendations for
2		attr	acting high-quality procurement professionals to
3		the	State; and
4	(3)	Appr	opriate funds to the state procurement office to
5		supp	ort the activities of the working group.
6	SECT	ION 2	. (a) There is established a procurement
7	services	conso	lidation working group, which shall:
8	(1)	Deve	lop a plan for a five-year phased in
9		cons	olidation, under the state procurement office, of
10		all	state executive branch procurement services and
11		staf	f, except the department of education, Hawaii
12		heal	th systems corporation, University of Hawaii, and
13		offi	ce of Hawaiian affairs. The plan shall include:
14		(A)	An identification of the specific positions and
15			functions to be transferred from each department
16			to the state procurement office;
17		(B)	Proposed dates of transfer for each position and
18			function;
19		(C)	Proposed procurement facility, personnel, and
20			operational infrastructure needs of the
21			consolidated procurement agency, with projections

1		on future integration needs as additional
2		agencies' procurement staff and services are
3		added;
4		(D) Recommendations to enable the state procurement
5		office to provide expert support to the
6		procurement activities of all state agencies to
7		meet the needs of the agencies and the public;
8		and
9		(E) Recommendations to ensure that agency services
10		are not interrupted during the consolidation; and
11	(2)	Make recommendations to attract high-quality
12		procurement professionals to the State, including the
13		use of internships and the feasibility of exempting
14		certain positions from the requirements of chapters 76
15		and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
16	(b)	Members of the working group shall include:
17	(1)	The administrator of the state procurement office, who
18		shall serve as chairperson;
19	(2)	The single executive or chairperson of the executive
20		board, as the case may be, of each principal executive
21		hranch denartment or that nerson's designee

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1		excepting the department of education, Hawaii health
2		systems corporation, University of Hawaii, and office
3		of Hawaiian affairs; and
4	(3)	Any other person that the administrator of the state
5		procurement office wishes to invite to serve on the
6		working group.
7	(c)	The working group shall be administratively attached
8	to the de	epartment of accounting and general services. The state
9	procureme	ent office shall provide administrative support to the
10	working g	group.
11	(d)	The working group shall submit an interim report to
12	the legis	slature, no later than twenty days prior to the
13	convening	g of the regular session of 2023, and a final report of
14	its findi	ngs and recommendations no later than twenty days prior
15	to the co	onvening of the regular session of 2024. The reports
16	shall inc	clude:
17	(1)	The plan for the phased in consolidation of state
18		procurement services developed pursuant to subsection
19		(a)(1), including a detailed five-year phased in
20		schedule;

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	(2)	Recommendations to attract might quarrey procurement
2		professionals to the State;
3	(3)	Plans for the development and implementation of a
4		multi-tiered certified training program to ensure that
5		all procurement staff take necessary training to
6		conduct procurement correctly;
7	(4)	Plans for the implementation of an accounting-
8		oriented, multi-module, data-based procurement
9		automation system that integrates all procurement
10		activities, including solicitation and contract
11		management; and
12	(5)	Any proposed legislation.
13	(e)	The working group shall dissolve on June 30, 2024.
14	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
16	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
17	the state	procurement office to support the activities of the
18	procureme	nt services consolidation working group, including the
19	hiring of	staff and the creation of a phased in consolidation
20	plan.	

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state
- 2 procurement office for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Procurement; State Procurement Office; Phased Consolidation Plan; Working Group; Report; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes a procurement services consolidation working group, which shall develop a plan for the phased in consolidation, under the state procurement office, of all state executive branch procurement services and staff within five years, except those of the department of education, Hawaii health systems corporation, University of Hawaii, and office of Hawaiian affairs. Requires the working group to recommend ways to attract high-quality procurement professionals to the State. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD2)

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
