# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

---

URGING THE HAWAII BROADBAND AND DIGITAL EQUITY OFFICE TO  
PRIORITIZE ACCESS TO BROADBAND SERVICES IN RURAL AREAS  
THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, the ongoing coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19)  
2 pandemic highlights the significant need for access to broadband  
3 services in rural areas throughout the State; and  
4

5 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 206S-1, Hawaii Revised  
6 Statutes, digital equity means "a condition in which all  
7 individuals and communities have the information technology  
8 capacity needed for full participation in society, democracy,  
9 and the economy"; and  
10

11 WHEREAS, access to broadband services has meant the  
12 difference between an employee's ability to work remotely or  
13 potentially face unemployment; and  
14

15 WHEREAS, the lack of access to broadband services prevents  
16 health care professionals from providing telehealth services to  
17 those who would otherwise be unable to receive proper medical  
18 care; and  
19

20 WHEREAS, the lack of access to broadband services hampers  
21 the ability of the State to deliver consistent and meaningful  
22 distance learning for all students; and  
23

24 WHEREAS, reliable broadband access is also necessary for  
25 residents seeking to access social services such as unemployment  
26 claims, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits,  
27 vital records, and other critical government services; and

29 WHEREAS, reliable broadband access affects such simple but  
30 important services as registering for COVID-19 vaccinations and  
31 testing; and


1 WHEREAS, reliable access to high-speed broadband services  
2 is essential for all individuals and communities in Hawaii to  
3 fully participate in society, democracy, and the economy; and

5 WHEREAS, additional investment must be made to ensure  
6 digital equity in the State by increasing access to broadband  
7 services especially for those in rural communities that lack  
8 adequate broadband infrastructure and; now, therefore,

10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first  
11 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the  
12 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii Broadband  
13 and Digital Equity Office is urged to prioritize access to  
14 broadband services in rural areas throughout the State; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
17 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the  
18 Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism and  
19 State Broadband Coordinator.
