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## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO ESTABLISH OR CONTRACT  
WITH A VICTIM SERVICE PROVIDER TO MAINTAIN AN EMERGENCY  
SHELTER FOR CHILDREN WHO ARE SURVIVORS OF SEX TRAFFICKING.

1           WHEREAS, according to a September 2018 report on sex  
2 trafficking in Hawaii published by Arizona State University  
3 School of Social Work and the Hawaii State Commission on the  
4 Status of Women, it is estimated that one out of every eleven  
5 men in Hawaii over the age of eighteen is an online sex buyer  
6 and that there are 74,362 potential sex buyers in Hawaii; and  
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8           WHEREAS, during the COVID-19 pandemic, a service provider  
9 for sex trafficking victims in Hawaii reported a three hundred  
10 percent increase in demand for services, which included trauma-  
11 informed care; and  
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13           WHEREAS, as part of a juvenile justice reform measure, the  
14 Legislature passed Act 208, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, which  
15 authorized the creation and development of the Kawaiiloa Youth  
16 and Family Wellness Center at Hawaii Youth Correctional Facility  
17 sites, including "crisis shelters for victims of human  
18 trafficking"; and  
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20           WHEREAS, within just a few months of that authorization,  
21 the Kawaiiloa campus included an assessment center and shelter  
22 for young victims of sex trafficking; and  
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24           WHEREAS, in the spring of 2021, the nonprofit organization  
25 Ho'ōla Nā Pua opened a thirty-two bed residential treatment  
26 program for victims of sex trafficking in Hawaii; and  
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28           WHEREAS, however, neither of these two facilities serve as  
29 an emergency shelter for child survivors of sex trafficking; and

1 WHEREAS, the State only has one emergency shelter for child  
2 survivors of sex trafficking, which temporarily ceased  
3 operations in 2021 because of unexpected budget shortfalls; and  
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5 WHEREAS, maintaining an emergency shelter for child  
6 survivors of sex trafficking will improve the State's  
7 effectiveness in responding to sexual exploitation by allowing  
8 government agencies and victim service providers to establish a  
9 coordinated continuum of care and protect victims in a  
10 centralized location; now, therefore,  
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12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first  
13 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the  
14 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of  
15 Human Services is urged to establish or contract with a victim  
16 service provider to operate and maintain an emergency shelter  
17 for children who are survivors of sex trafficking; and  
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19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the emergency shelter is urged  
20 to provide services that include but are not limited to housing,  
21 rehabilitation, medical, mental health, therapeutic, legal, and  
22 diagnostic services for child survivors of sex trafficking; and  
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24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director  
26 of Human Services, and Executive Director of the Hawaii State  
27 Commission on the Status of Women.
