SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ADOPTION OF A STATE POLICY ASSURING THAT SAVINGS
REALIZED BY THE STATE THROUGH THE EXTENSION OF FEDERAL
MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PERCENTAGE PAYMENTS OF ONE HUNDRED
PERCENT FOR NATIVE HAWAIIAN HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS IS USED TO
ADDRESS HEALTH DISPARITIES EXPERIENCED BY HAWAIIAN
COMMUNITIES.

1 WHEREAS, PAPA OLA LŌKAHI is a Hawaii nonprofit corporation,
2 501(c)(3) public charity, and consortium of public agencies and
3 private nonprofit organizations concerned with improving Native
4 Hawaiian cultural, physical, mental, and spiritual health and
5 well-being, including by entering into agreements or memoranda
6 of understanding with relevant organizations that are capable of
7 providing resources or services to the Native Hawaiian health
8 care systems that serve the unique health needs of Hawaiian
9 communities; and

11 WHEREAS, AHARO HAWAII (AHARO) is a Hawaii nonprofit
12 corporation, 501(c)(3) public charity, and consortium of Hawaii
13 nonprofit corporations each of which is a 501(c)(3) public
14 charity and federally qualified community health center that has
15 demonstrated records of contributing to the health and well-
16 being of Native Hawaiians and providing a wide range of
17 culturally-sensitive, holistic, and primary care health services
18 to predominately rural, multi-generational Native Hawaiian
19 communities in medically underserved areas within the State of
20 Hawaii; and

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22 WHEREAS, AHARO is currently comprised of five federally
23 qualified health center organizations: Bay Clinic, Inc., Hamakua
24 Health Center, Inc., Molokai Ohana Health Care, Inc. (dba
25 Molokai Community Health Center), Waianae District Comprehensive
26 Health and Hospital Board, Inc. (dba Waianae Coast Comprehensive
27 Health Center), and Waimanalo Health Center; and

1 WHEREAS, AHARO member organizations integrate traditional
2 native Hawaiian healing practices into their primary care
3 services and an AHARO member organization has established a
4 Kupuna Council of traditional Hawaiian healers recognized by
5 PAPA OLA LŌKAHI which distinguishes practitioners of Hawaiian
6 healing traditions from medical clinicians in Hawaii and
7 provides for the protection and preservation of such healing
8 practices as assured by the Hawaii State Constitution; and
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10 WHEREAS, under section 9815 of the American Rescue Plan Act
11 of 2021 ("ARPA"), the federal government will pay one hundred
12 percent of the cost of Medicaid services provided at Native
13 Hawaiian Health Centers for sixteen fiscal year quarters (which
14 may be extended); and
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16 WHEREAS, PAPA OLA LŌKAHI and AHARO have agreed that AHARO
17 member health centers will serve as additional "Native Hawaiian
18 Health Centers" and are recognized as part of the federal effort
19 to address health disparities experienced by Native Hawaiians;
20 and
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22 WHEREAS, the current limited QUEST dental program does not
23 address the needs in multi-generational Hawaiian communities
24 where extensive dental work is needed; and
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26 WHEREAS, full adult dental services are a required service
27 of a federally qualified health center and are typically
28 supported through state match; and
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30 WHEREAS, state savings, realized from the Native Hawaiian
31 Federal Medical Assistance Percentage recalculation, should be
32 used to address continuing health disparities realized by Native
33 Hawaiians which include dental disease and the early onset of
34 chronic diseases; and
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36 WHEREAS, these supplemental healthcare services should be
37 provided by healthcare providers authorized by PAPA OLA LŌKAHI;
38 now, therefore,
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40 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
41 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the
42 House of Representatives concurring, that all executive

1 departments are urged to review their policies and prioritize
2 the goal of the adoption of a state policy assuring that savings
3 realized by the State through the Federal Medical Assistance
4 Percentage adjustment for Native Hawaiians is used to address
5 health disparities experienced by Hawaiian communities; and
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7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
8 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the members of Hawaii's
9 congressional delegation; Governor; Director of Health; Director
10 of Human Services; Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the
11 Office of Hawaiian Affairs; Executive Director of PAPA OLA
12 LŌKAHI; President of AHARO HAWAII; Chief Executive Office of the
13 Bay Clinic, Inc.; Chief Executive Officer of the Hamakua Health
14 Center, Inc.; Chief Executive Officer of the Molokai Community
15 Health Center; Chairperson of the Waianae District Comprehensive
16 Health and Hospital Board, Inc., and Chief Executive Officer of
17 the Waimanalo Health Center.
