SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO DEVELOP PROTOCOLS FOR HOSPITALS IN THE STATE TO IMPROVE THE TREATMENT OF PATIENTS CONTEMPLATING SUICIDE.

WHEREAS, suicide is the second leading cause of death among 2 fifteen to thirty-four year olds and tenth leading cause of death overall in the United States; and

WHEREAS, despite improvements in overall health and health 6 care, the national suicide rate has risen approximately twentyseven percent in the last fifteen years; and

WHEREAS, health care organizations have a unique opportunity to help prevent suicide, since people at risk of suicide are often seen in health care settings and the majority of those who die by suicide were seen by a professional in the 12 year prior to their death, yet were not diagnosed with a mental health disorder; and

WHEREAS, care for people with suicide risk is highly variable, gaps in care for individuals at risk of suicide exist and that a study to develop recommendations is needed to close those gaps; and

WHEREAS, suicide prevention in health care systems should be treated similarly to heart attack prevention, with an emphasis on targeted preventive interventions for individuals with elevated risk levels; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, that the Department of Health is requested to develop protocols for hospitals in the State to improve the treatment of patients contemplating suicide; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the hospital protocols developed by the Department of Health are requested to include the following features:
