## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO INCREASE LOCAL FUNDING FOR METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATIONS AND TO PURSUE FURTHER FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES UNDER THE FEDERAL BIPARTISAN INFRASTRUCTURE LAW.

WHEREAS, the cost of building and maintaining infrastructure is one of the most costly annual expenses to the State of Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, the new Federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law will provide an injection of federal funding that creates an opportunity for the State of Hawaii to reduce the cost of building new infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, much of the new federal money will come in the form of new or expanded programs, formula funding, and discretionary grants, which will require additional resources to apply for and manage; and

WHEREAS, planning is an essential part of the federal funding process, and deemed necessary by the federal government, to take advantage of certain funding opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) are essential in the process of receiving federal funding for infrastructure projects; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to federal law, U.S. Code Title 49 Chapter 5303(h)(1), MPOs have broad authority with respect to planning infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the MPOs in the State of Hawaii have traditionally been understaffed when compared with other MPOs across the United States and in relation to the importance of their role, as such the State has lost potential opportunities to receive additional federal funding for infrastructure projects; now, therefore.
