Your Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, to which was referred H.R. No. 130 entitled:

"HOUSE RESOLUTION APOLOGIZING TO THE NATIVE HAWAIIAN PEOPLE FOR THE EFFECTIVE PROHIBITION IN HAWAII SCHOOLS OF THE INSTRUCTIONAL USE OF THE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE FROM 1896 TO 1986,"


Your Committee notes this resolution is not meant to create or acknowledge any liability on behalf of the State of Hawaii.
