Your Committee on Energy & Environmental Protection, to which was referred S.B. No. 3229, S.D. 2, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO GEOTHERMAL ROYALTIES,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is to:

- Cap the amount of royalties from geothermal resources that are to be paid to the State and to the county in which the geothermal resources are located;
- (2) Establish and appropriate funds out of the University of Hawaii Geothermal Exploration Special Fund for the Hawaii Groundwater and Geothermal Resources Center to further the discovery and development of geothermal resources;
- (3) Provide for the deposit of certain royalties into the University of Hawaii Geothermal Exploration Special Fund; and
- (4) Require the entities that receive geothermal royalties to submit an annual report to the Legislature.

Your Committee received testimony in support of this measure from the University of Hawai'i System, Hawaii Groundwater and Geothermal Resources Center, Sustainable Energy Hawai'i, and two individuals.
