Dear Senators:

I am in receipt of your letter dated August 6, 2020 concerning our discussion during the Senate Special Committee on COVID-19. Please see my responses below:

- To clarify the status of the CARES funds, please be advised that we have not received or used any of the CARES funds for any purchases or projects. Today, we will submit to the Governor a Request for Use of Coronavirus Relief Funds. (Please see the attached AIR-ER 20.0192)
- Due to the ACT 9 language of: (3) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, we determined that we could not spend the entire \$90M in the given timeline. The State of Hawaii, Department of Transportation, Airports Division (HDOTA) will ask the Legislature for an emergency appropriation for the remaining \$20M from the General Fund.

SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR USE OF CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUNDS

Consistent with the requirements of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), the Department of Transportation, Airports Division (DOT-A) requests a \$70,000,000 sub-award from the Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF).

This request qualifies as an allowable use of the CRF because the funds will be used for allowable Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVD-19)-related expenditures, as indicated on the attached "Attestation of Qualifying Coronavirus Relief Fund Expenditures" (Form CRF-2). The DOT-A understands that construction must be expended by December 28, 2020, based on the lapse date of the respective appropriation, with payment for such work made within 90 days thereafter, and any unexpended funds may be required to be transferred to the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund, pursuant to the authorizing legislation.

This request is for the purchase and installation of thermal scanners with facial imaging, including monitoring equipment, at the five major airports: Daniel K. Inouye International Airport, Kahului Airport, Ellison Onizuka Kona International Airport at Keahole, Hilo International Airport, and Lihue Airport. Phase I and Phase II will install the thermal cameras at all gates to scan passengers as they deplane the aircraft for body temperature of 100.4 degrees and higher. Phase III will install facial imaging tracing cameras throughout the terminals, where personnel in control rooms will be able to trace the movement of passengers until they are retained.

Mobile airport medical facilities (one at each airport) will be procured where further secondary medical screening will be conducted on retained passengers. Professional clinical services will also be obtained to include, but not limited to, the purchase of equipment and testing services to increase Hawaii's testing capability beyond the current 3,000 tests per day.

ATTESTATION OF QUALIFYING CORONAVIRUS REFIELF FUND EXPENDITURES

I understand and certify to the following:

I understand the Coronaivrus Relief Fund (CRF) may only be used to cover expenditures that:

- 1. Are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- 2. Were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 28, 2020.
