Status & Testimony	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS.  Prohibits the use of important agricultural lands and lands with class A productivity ratings for waste disposal.	AEN, JDC

SB 2992 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Establishes the agriculture investment special fund to support local agricultural producers. Makes an appropriation.	AEN, WAM
SB 2998 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO RECYCLING. Requires the department of health to implement the auditor's recommendations for the deposit beverage container program, including developing a risk-based selection process to select reports submitted by distributors and redemption centers for audit.	AEN, WAM
SB 3273 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO A DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION. Establishes a department of environmental protection by July 1, 2026. Creates a department of environmental protection working group to address the logistics required for the State to establish a department of environmental protection. Requires the working group to submit a report to the legislature prior to the 2025 regular session.	AEN, WAM
Status & Testimony	RELATING TO COASTAL LANDS. Requires the Legislative Reference Bureau to conduct a five- year study on the coastal lands in the State that are affected by impending sea level rise. Appropriates funds for the study.	AEN, WAM
