LAT, CPC, FIN (HSCR67-22) Requires the department of business, economic development, and **Status** tourism to establish and maintain a statewide data hub to collect employer and employee data. Authorizes the department of business, economic development, and tourism to determine the type of employer and employee data to collect, the functions of the statewide data hub, and access and document retention policies for the data. Appropriates funds. Effective 12/25/2040. (HD1) RELATING TO HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS. HB 1976, HD1 PDP, CPC, FIN (HSCR142-22) Establishes the safe home program to provide matching and nonmatching grants for installation of wind resistive devices to single-Status family, owner-occupied, residential properties in certain circumstances. Creates a permanent position within the insurance division of the department of commerce and consumer affairs to implement and administer the safe home program. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1) RELATING TO HOUSING. HSG/WAL, CPC, HB 1837, HD1 (HSCR51-22) Requires each county to submit biennial reports to the legislature on its FIN efforts to reduce zoning and regulatory barriers to housing Status development. Requires the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation and Hawaii public housing authority to submit biennial reports, based on their individual review of the counties' reports, to the

Requires all state building construction projects and state highway projects to use building and construction materials that seek to reduce their carbon footprint, where feasible and cost effective. Effective 7/1/2100. (HD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
