Status OAHU.

Authorizes a GET exemption for businesses investing more than \$750,000 over a 10-year period and creating a minimum of 50 job positions for the purpose of business development in the Pearl-City Aiea and Waipahu opportunity zones. Establishes a tax credit for upgrading infrastructure in the Pearl-City Aiea and Waipahu

opportunity zones.

Status Establishes a civil penalty for failure to respond to an inquiry or

request for information during a state tax examination or investigation.

HB 1491 Status	RELATING TO THE CIGARETTE TAX AND TOBACCO TAX LAW.  Repeals the deferred payment purchase option for cigarette tax stamps.  Requires licensees to pay for stamps at the time of purchase using cash, certified check, or bank transfer.	ECD, FIN
HB 1492 Status	RELATING TO TAXATION. Establishes a civil penalty for failure to respond to the Department of Taxation in relation to an inspection or examination of records.	ECD, FIN
HB 1493 Status	RELATING TO THE TAX ADMINISTRATION SPECIAL FUND. Increases the amount of moneys maintained in the tax administration special fund. Amends the purpose of the fund.	ECD, FIN
HB 1494 Status	RELATING TO SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT SECTION.  Amends the purpose and duties of the Special Enforcement Section of the Department of Taxation.	ECD, FIN
HB 1507 Status	RELATING TO TAX FAIRNESS. Increases the tax rate on capital gains. Makes the state earned income tax credit refundable and permanent. Applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2022.	ECD, FIN
HB 1569 Status	RELATING TO THE REFUNDABLE FOOD/EXCISE TAX CREDIT. Increases the income threshold eligible to claim the refundable food/excise tax credit.	ECD, FIN
HB 1709 Status	RELATING TO TAXATION. Establishes an income tax credit for taxpayers who purchase and install a whole house water filter system.	ECD, FIN
HB 1926 Status	RELATING TO TAXATION. Retroactively restores the foreign-trade zones exemption from taxation under the general excise tax law, use tax law, fuel tax law, liquor tax law, and cigarette tax and tobacco tax law.	ECD, FIN
HB 2226 Status	RELATING TO THE TAX CREDIT FOR RESEARCH ACTIVITIES. Adds a cap for an eligible taxpayer and the taxpayer's related entities per taxable year; consolidates the survey and certification requirements; amends the annual aggregate cap; and requires certification on a first-come, first-served basis to be based on the date a complete application is received, subject to certain conditions, for the tax credit for research activities.	ECD, FIN
HB 2406 Status	RELATING TO TAXATION.  Makes the state earned income tax credit refundable and permanent.  Allows nonrefundable state earned income tax credits claimed for certain taxable years that exceeded tax liability for the original claim year to be credited against net tax liability in subsequent years until exhausted, up to the end of the 2022 tax year.	ECD, FIN

Conforms Hawaii income and estate and generation-skipping transfer tax laws to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended as of December 31, 2021.
