HB 1501 RELATING TO THE HAWAII NATURAL ENERGY INSTITUTE. EEP, FIN Status Establishes the research partnership program within the Hawaii natural

Establishes the research partnership program within the Hawaii natural energy institute that allows businesses or private entities to partner with or utilize research conducted by the institute for the purposes of

expansion, under certain conditions.

HB 1937 RELATING TO THE HAWAII HYDROGEN STRATEGIC PLAN. EEP, FIN

Status Requires the Hawaii Natural Energy Institute to conduct a study to examine the State's ability to advance hydrogen production from local renewable energy resources and develop the Hawaii Hydrogen

Strategic Plan utilizing the results of its study, which shall be reviewed and updated every four years. Requires a report to the Legislature.

Appropriates funds.

HB 1682 RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE EEP, FIN Status REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST NEXT LEVEL SOLUTIONS GROUP INC. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist Next Level Solutions Group Inc. in developing a waste-to-energy facility. RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSE EEP, FIN HB 2203 REVENUE BONDS TO ASSIST DIBSHAWAII LLC. **Status** Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist DIBSHawaii LLC in the construction of a net zero carbon capture storage utilization platform that will recover vented carbon dioxide emissions and scrub them into food grade liquid carbon dioxide. HB 2042 RELATING TO SOLAR ENERGY. EEP, JHA **Status** Permits the governing body of a county to create, by ordinance, a process for the recordation and enforcement of solar easements.

Permits the governing body of a county to create, by ordinance, a process for the recordation and enforcement of solar easements. Allows counties to require individuals claiming a solar right to record that right by filing a declaration with the county clerk. Permits the governing body of a county to require, by ordinance, the trimming of vegetation that blocks solar radiation from solar energy devices. Authorizes the ordinance to include a designation for the cost of

trimming.

Status

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

Permits composting and co-composting operations in agricultural districts. Appropriates funds to restore an environmental health specialist IV position to the solid and hazardous waste branch of the department of health. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)
