Includes best practice destination management and regenerative tourism under the scope and responsibilities of the Hawaii Tourism Authority (HTA). Requires HTA to develop a tourism management plan that includes tourism marketing, best practice destination management, and regenerative tourism. Requires HTA to allocate most marketing moneys to the respective county economic development offices for visitor marketing contracts and nonprofits that benefit the county.
