SB 514, SD1 RELATING TO THE GENERAL FUND. FIN

(SSCR57) Provides a tax credit to taxpayers and makes deposits to the emergency and budget reserve fund and other post-employment benefits trust fund

pursuant to article VII, section 6, of the Hawaii Constitution.

Appropriates funds. (SD1)

SB 2475, SD2 RELATING TO TAXATION. FIN (SSCR2925) Clarifies that amounts received or accrued for wharfage and demurrage

Status services are exempt under the general excise tax law. Clarifies that amounts received for the transportation or storage of cargo are not exempt under the general excise tax law. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 3236, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1380-22) Status	RELATING TO MEDICAID PATIENT CARE. Appropriates funds to provide for a one-time enhanced payment equal to 15 per cent of Medicaid patient payments of fiscal year 2022-2023 made to any eligible facility in the State, as determined by the department of human services, that provides care to medicaid patients in medicare-certified nursing facility, community care foster family homes, and expanded adult residential care homes, to assist with pandemic-related costs and lost revenues. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	PDP, HHH, FIN
SB 3221, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1399-22) Status	RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL SISTER-STATE RELATIONS. Appropriates moneys to support international sister-state relations. Effective 7/1/2044. (HD1)	CAI, CPC, FIN
SB 2731, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1194-22) Status	RELATING TO THE BERNICE PAUAHI BISHOP MUSEUM. Appropriates moneys to support the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum. Effective 7/1/2044. (HD1)	CAI, FIN
SB 915, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1193-22) Status	RELATING TO SPECIAL NUMBER PLATES. Authorizes the issuance of special number plates to commemorate Duke Kahanamoku. Effective 7/1/2044. (HD1)	CAI, FIN
SB 2770, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1324-22) Status	RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN REHABILITATION PROGRAMS. Requires the department of public safety, in collaboration with the office of Hawaiian affairs, to create a Native Hawaiian rehabilitation program for prison inmates that emphasizes Native Hawaiian values and cultural practices. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	CMV, JHA, FIN
SB 2641, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1326-22) Status	RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY. Appropriates funds for residential programs that allow minor children to remain with their mothers while participating in the program, to reduce the risk of trauma and multigenerational incarceration, including community-based furlough programs, residential drug treatment programs, therapeutic community programs, and mental health programs. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	CMV, JHA, FIN
SB 3293, SD2, HD2 (HSCR1352-22) Status	RELATING TO ASSISTANCE FOR PERSONS COMPLETING A TERM OF IMPRISONMENT. Establishes within the judiciary a five-year recidivism prevention pilot program consisting of three components: a housing voucher program, child care voucher program, and employer income tax credit program to assist the reentry efforts of certain individuals who exited the women's community correctional center. Appropriates funds for the program and five transition navigator positions within the judiciary. Effective 7/1/3000. Repeals 7/1/2027. (HD2)	CMV, JHA, FIN
SB 2637, SD1, HD2 (HSCR1333-22) Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Mandates that there be a community-based work furlough program for incarcerated women in the State. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)	CMV, JHA, FIN

SB 2639, HD2 (HSCR1328-22) Status

RELATING TO THE COMPREHENSIVE OFFENDER REENTRY SYSTEM.

Requires the offender reentry office of the department of public safety to develop and implement a risk needs assessment tool that is specifically intended to assess the needs of women offenders. Requires a report to the legislature. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD2)

SB 2771, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1325-22) **Status**

RELATING TO RISK AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT FOR FEMALE OFFENDERS.

Requires the department of public safety to develop a pretrial female risk and needs assessments tool and conduct internal female risk and needs assessments to measure female offenders' risk of flight, reoffending, or harm to the community. Requires the pretrial female risk and needs assessment tool to consider factors important to women when considering their risks of reoffending and their treatment needs. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

SB 3295, SD1, HD2 (HSCR1337-22) **Status**

RELATING TO CORRECTIONS.

CMV, JHA, FIN Establishes the women's corrections implementation commission

within the department of public safety to provide oversight over state correctional facilities and community correctional centers that incarcerate women; receive and investigate complaints from incarcerated women; monitor the criminal justice system's progress in implementing reforms; and monitor programs and data that are important to ensuring successful outcomes for women in the correctional system. Requires annual reports to the legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD2)

SB 3294, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1323-22) **Status**

RELATING TO REENTRY PLANNING CIRCLES.

SB 3085, SD2, HD2 (HSCR1329-22) Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII CODE OF MILITARY JUSTICE. Adopts a new Hawaii Code of Military Justice to promote order and discipline in the state military forces by fostering an independent military justice system and updating nonjudicial punishment and courts-martial procedures. Effective 1/1/2222. (HD2)

RELATING TO PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT. SB 3329, SD1, HD2

(HSCR1343-22) Status

Repeals the Citizen Participation in Government Act. Enacts the Uniform Public Expression Protection Act. Effective 7/1/2112. (HD2)

RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT. SB 3372, SD1, HD2 (HSCR1427-22) Authorizes the office of administrative hearings, where it is determined that an award of a contract is in violation of law and the award is Status

rescinded and the contract, if executed, is terminated or declared null and void, to award the government contract to the next lowest bidder or next responsible offeror, if certain conditions are met. Effective

7/1/2112. (HD2)

SB 3075, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1217-22) Status

RELATING TO FRANCHISE TAX.

Ensures that the \$2,000,000 franchise tax payment is credited in full to the compliance resolution fund for use by the division of financial institutions. Specifies that if franchise tax collections are insufficient, the difference will be derived from income tax collections. Clarifies that franchise tax revenues in excess of \$2,000,000 shall be deposited into the general fund. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

SB 1105, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1444-22) Status

RELATING TO THE MORTGAGE LOAN RECOVERY FUND.

Allows a person aggrieved by the fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit of a mortgage loan originator company licensee to receive restitution payment upon a final court order. Repeals fees paid by mortgage loan originator companies and their branch office locations to the mortgage loan recovery fund. Provides the commissioner of financial institutions with the authority to consider applications to recover from the fund. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing.
