THE PUBLIC LAND TRUST. Status

> Establishes the office of Hawaiian affairs' pro rata share of the moneys derived from the public land trust. Transfers funds from the carryforward trust holding account to OHA. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

SB 1121, SD2 RELATING TO HOUSING. JHA, FIN

(HSCR1444) Exempts housing developed by the department of Hawaiian home lands from general excise taxes. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) **Status**

SB 2623, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1269-22) Status	RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT. Excludes from any waiting list maintained by the department of Hawaiian home lands any lessee or successor who sells or transfers their lease on a tract of Hawaiian home lands for personal gain. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 3357, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1338-22) Status	RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Requires certain departments and agencies to provide grants to tax- exempt nonprofit organizations that have experience and expertise in supporting and advancing Native Hawaiian communities. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 3046, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1335-22) Status	MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL. Makes an emergency appropriation to the department of the attorney general for use in major litigation involving the State. Extends the lapsing date to 6/30/2023. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 3041, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1257-22) Status	MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES. Makes appropriations and approves payments for claims against the State, its officers, and its employees. Effective 1/1/2222. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 3044, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1255-22) Status	RELATING TO TOBACCO MANUFACTURER QUALIFIED ESCROW FUNDS. Provides a mechanism to assign nonparticipating tobacco manufacturers' qualified escrow fund balances to the State. Provides a mechanism for the financial institution acting as the escrow agent of the qualified escrow fund to petition the courts to authorize transfer of funds to the State when the qualified escrow fund is abandoned. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 1048, SD1 (HSCR1267-22) Status	RELATING TO HAWAII CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER FEES. Provides authority for the Hawaii criminal justice data center to set and collect fees for services provided. (SD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 2390, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1253-22) Status	RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY. Increases the number of associate judges on the intermediate court of appeals from five to six. Appropriates funds. Effective 1/1/2222. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 2740, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1254-22) Status	RELATING TO GUARDIANS AD LITEM. Allows the judiciary to compensate guardians ad litem for involuntary hospitalization and assisted community treatment petitions at a rate higher than existing statutory guidelines. Makes an appropriation. Effective 1/1/2222. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 2114 (HSCR1252-22) Status	RELATING TO THE CHILDREN'S JUSTICE PROGRAM. Updates the purpose of the children's justice program to include investigation and management of cases involving suspected or confirmed child sex trafficking, commercial sexual exploitation of children, other child maltreatment, and child witnesses to crime or violence. Makes conforming amendments.	JHA, FIN

SB 2136, HD1 (HSCR1266-22) Status	RELATING TO JURY SERVICE. Prohibits juror exclusion based on gender identity or expression. Effective 1/1/2222. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 2663, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1263-22) Status	RELATING TO FILING FEES. Changes the filing fee schedule for paternity actions by establishing an initial filing fee of \$100 and eliminating fees to file motions. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 416, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1262-22) Status	RELATING TO WITNESS FEES AND REIMBURSEMENTS IN CRIMINAL CASES. Clarifies applicable reimbursement to the State or defendant for expert witness fees, as it pertains to testimony, preparation, and in-court attendance in state court criminal proceedings. Increases per diem payments for all witnesses. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 3114, SD2 (HSCR1265-22) Status	RELATING TO MARRIAGE LICENSES. Establishes a \$25 fee for all licenses to solemnize a marriage to be deposited into the vital statistics improvement special fund. Requires the Department of Health to account for the collection and deposit of the fee into the vital statistics improvement special fund. Repeals fees related to obtaining a license to solemnize civil marriage ceremonies. (SD2)	JHA, FIN
SB 2162, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1260-22) Status	RELATING TO RANKED CHOICE VOTING. Establishes ranked-choice voting for special federal elections and special elections of vacant county council seats. Effective 1/1/2222. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 2741 (HSCR1251-22) Status	RELATING TO THE COMMISSION TO PROMOTE UNIFORM LEGISLATION. Provides a limited exemption for the Hawaii Commission to Promote Uniform Legislation from certain requirements of part I of chapter 92, HRS, for the purpose of allowing commissioners of the Commission to Promote Uniform Legislation to attend and participate in a full capacity in meetings hosted by the Uniform Law Commission, without any limitation on the number of participating commissioners, in furtherance of its goal of representing and promoting uniformity of legislation for the State. SB 3189, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1259-22) Status	RELATING TO GAMBLING. Amends the offenses of promoting gambling in the first and second degree to a class B felony and class C felony, respectively. Excludes the offenses of promoting gambling in the first and second degree from qualifying for deferred acceptance of guilty plea or nolo contendere plea. (HD1)	JHA, FIN
SB 2373, SD1, HD1 (HSCR1374-22) Status	RELATING TO OFFENDER REENTRY. Establishes a position and appropriates funds for a program named "project reset", which will help offenders secure post-release housing to support their reentry, rehabilitation, and employment. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	CMV, HHH, FIN

Requires the auditor of fireworks and articles pyrotechnic records for each county fire department to submit to the legislature an annual report detailing inventory, recordkeeping, and sales of fireworks to license or permit holders. Makes grants-in-aid to the counties to cover costs associated with reporting the information to the legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

Adds and updates definitions to satisfy current industry practice needs. Aligns and remedies inconsistencies between chapters on barbering and beauty culture. Removes the five-year license requirement for barber and beauty operator board of barbering and cosmetology member seats. Raises fees for penalties and disciplinary actions and removes medical clearance requirements. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD2)
