SB 3002 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Provides additional guidance and updates the reporting obligations for state departments, including the department of education, pursuant to Acts 175 and 176 (SLH 2021), which established programmatic goals for the purchase and procurement of locally sourced products. Effective 1/1/2023.	GVO, WAM
SB 3015 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Amends the cash or protest bond amount for parties initiating administrative proceedings for review of certain protest decisions.	GVO, WAM
SB 3034 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO JOINT CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR LISTING. Clarifies the listing of joint contractors and subcontractors required for construction bids under section 103D-302, Hawaii Revised Statutes.	GVO, CPN
SB 3270 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT. Prohibits determinations of nonresponsibility, under the Hawaii Public Procurement Code, based solely on the failure to possess prior experience.	GVO, JDC

<u>SB 3350</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Requires that any procurement change order that increases the contract cost by more than 50% or substantially increases the scope of work be considered a new contract for procurement purpose.	GVO, WAM/JDC
<u>SB 3371</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE PROCUREMENT CODE. Requires parties to procurement protests to use best efforts to resolve issues at the procurement officer level before submission of a protest.	GVO, JDC
<u>SB 3372</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT. Authorizes, where it is determined that a solicitation or award of a contract is in violation of law, government contract to be rescinded and awarded to the person the contract would have been awarded to absent the violation.	GVO, JDC
<u>SB 3373</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT. Clarifies the deadline for submitting written protests that are based on the content of a solicitation.	GVO, JDC
<u>SB 3040</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	<u>RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.</u> <u>Amends the nomination process and the number of the members for the Procurement Policy Board; authorizes the State Procurement Administrator to develop and administer procurement automation systems and assess, charge, and collect a transaction fee from all vendors using the procurement automation systems; establish a procurement automation system special fund; and amends section 103D-1010, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to conform with the amendments made to section 103D-1001, HRS.</u>	<u>GVO, WAM</u> <u>[Measure added on 01-31-22</u>
