HB 1667 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Defines "clinical laboratory director" to include certain physicians, licensed clinical laboratory scientists, and pharmacists-in-charge of pharmacies. Amends the definition of "practice of pharmacy" to include the ordering and performing of certain Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments waived tests.	HHH, CPC, FIN
HB 1679 Status	RELATING TO ACUPUNCTURE. Makes comprehensive updates to chapter 436E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, regarding acupuncture practitioners to reflect modernized scopes of practice, titles, and licensing and renewal requirements, including thirty hours of continuing education per licensing biennium.	HHH, CPC, FIN
HB 1892 Status	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. Requires the Department of Health to provide to elderly residents free wireless broadband internet access in parking lots adjoining	HHH, CPC, FIN

Department of Health buildings in each county. Appropriates moneys.



HB 1783

RELATING TO PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGERS.
Addresses and defines pharmacy benefit manager practices. Creates enforcement authority by the insurance commissioner to suspend or revoke a pharmacy benefit manager's registration and impose fines.

HB 1575

RELATING TO PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS.

HHH, CPC, FIN Expands the scope of practice for physician assistants. Requires a sampling of medical records, rather than all medical records, to be reviewed when physician assistants prescribe controlled substances.

HB 1893RELATING TO THE OAHU REGIONAL HEALTH CAREHHH, CPC, FINStatusSYSTEM.Requires the transfer of the Daniel K. Akaka state veterans home to the

Hawaii Health Systems Corporation and then to the Department of Health as part of the Oahu Regional Health Care System. Extends the date of the transfer of the Oahu Regional Health Care System to the Department of Health by 1 year.

HB 1675
RELATING TO MEDICAL CARE FOR MINORS.
HHH, CPC, JHA
Permits minors to consent to medical care and services related to the

Permits minors to consent to medical care and services related to the diagnosis, treatment, or prevention of HIV. Specifies that a minor, under certain circumstances, shall not be liable for payment associated with the diagnosis, treatment, or prevention of HIV. Authorizes physician assistants, in addition to physicians and advanced practice registered nurses, to render such medical care and services to minors.

HB 1894 RELATING TO HUMAN REMAINS. HHH, JHA, CPC

Status Accommodates the use of both traditional Hawaiian burial practices and environmentally-friendly burial practices by including water

cremation in the treatment and disposal of human remains.

HB 1594 RELATING TO THE CENTER FOR NURSING. HHH, CPC, FIN

Requires all nursing license applicants to respond to the center for nursing workforce supply survey in conjunction with license renewal, provided that the license renewal shall not be contingent upon responding to the workforce supply survey and failure to respond to the workforce supply survey shall not result in encumbrance of the nurse's license. Increases the center for nursing fee from \$40 to \$60

per license biennium.

Status

HB 1795 RELATING TO HEALTH. HHH, HET, FIN

Status Expands the Hawaii health corps program and Hawaii rural health care provider loan repayment program to include incentives for psychologists and social workers. Makes the department of health

responsible for administering the Hawaii rural health care provider loan repayment program. Appropriates funds.

HB 1514 RELATING TO BIRDS. HHH, JHA, FIN

Status Requires the department of health to enforce a prohibition on the feeding of excessive numbers of feral birds without the need to first determine that odors and filth from bird waste are a nuisance. Provides

exceptions. Establishes penalties.

HB 1758
RELATING TO NURSES.
HHH, CPC, FIN
Status
Allows for temporary permits to be issued to registered nurses and

Allows for temporary permits to be issued to registered nurses and licensed practical nurses from a territory or foreign country that are

seeking a state license by endorsement.

HB 1579 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. HHH, CPC, FIN

Extends the deadline by which the transfer of the Oahu regional health care system from the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation to the Department of Health shall take place. Sets the manner by which the Oahu Regional Health Care System should request operational funding

during the transitional period. Exempts the working group from

Chapter 92, HRS. Appropriates moneys.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least <u>24 hours</u> prior to the hearing. Testimony received after this time will be stamped late and left to the discretion of the chair to consider. While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may not be processed.

If during the course of the hearing it appears that there will not be sufficient time to allow everyone to be heard, the chairperson reserves the right to limit the remaining testifiers to <u>two-minutes</u>. This two-minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.

Status

Committees meeting in the morning must adjourn prior to the day's Floor Session. Therefore, due to time constraints, not all testifiers may be provided an opportunity to offer verbal comments. However, remote testifiers' written submissions will be considered by the committee.
