RELATING TO CHILD ABUSE. **SB 2415** HMS, JDC Adds a requirement that the Department of Human Services Status & expunge a report or reports when the department finds that a **Testimony** miscarriage of justice would persist if the report or reports were not expunged. Requires the Department of Human Services to provide notice to all parties who are placed on the Hawaii Child Abuse and Neglect Registry. Provides an avenue for persons on the Hawaii Child Abuse and Neglect Registry to petition for removal from the registry.
