SB 2583 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Exempts lands set aside by the Governor to the Hawaii Housing and Finance Development Corporation from classification as public land subject to Department of Land and Natural Resources management; provided that the lands are not ceded lands. SB 2232	RELATING TO IMPORTANT HOUSING LANDS.	HOU/WTL, WAM
Status & Testimony	Establishes that all state-owned lands located within one mile of any rail mass transit station shall be designated as important housing lands to promote the development of homes priced	

below market rates for Hawaii residents who are owneroccupants and own no other real property. Requires state and county housing policies, tax policies, land use plans, ordinances, and rules to promote the long-term viability of important housing lands consistent with certain policies.

SB 2898

Status & Testimony

RELATING TO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.

Establishes the transit-oriented development infrastructure improvement district under the Hawaii community development authority. Establishes districts to comprise of and include the parcels of land within county-designated transit-oriented development zones, or within a one-half mile radius of a proposed or existing transit station if the county has not designated transit-oriented development zones, as determined by the transit-oriented development infrastructure improvement district board. Requires the transit-oriented development infrastructure improvement district board to develop a transit-oriented development infrastructure improvement program to identify necessary infrastructure improvements within the district. Establishes the transit-oriented development infrastructure improvement special fund.

<u>SB 2884</u>

Status & Testimony

RELATING TO WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT.

Provides that, if the Commission on Water Resource Management fails to review a permit application relating to new water uses or new water sources for affordable housing development, and issue a decision on that application within the existing statutory period, the application is deemed to be approved. Convenes a Water Resource Management for Affordable Housing Development Working Group upon the initiation of a federal investigation or inquiry relating to the Commission on Water Resource Management to address the concerns raised by the investigation or inquiry. Requires the Auditor to submit a report on the effectiveness of this Act. Sunsets two years after the effective date of the Act.
