MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO FUND A GRANT TO THE BOARD OF WATER SUPPLY FOR EMERGENCY OPERATIONS, FUTURE PLANNING, AND

GROUND WATER REMEDIATION.

Makes an emergency appropriation to the leaking underground storage tank fund to fund a grant to the Oahu Board of Water Supply for emergency operations, future planning, and remediation resulting from the contamination of the Southern Oahu Basal Aquifer; provided that the Department of Health seeks to enter into a memorandum of understanding with the United States Navy to reimburse the Department of Health for the full amount of the appropriation.

RELATING TO WATER CATCHMENT SYSTEMS.

Requires the Department of Health to regulate water catchment systems and provide testing to businesses who utilize water catchment systems. Requires the department to provide technical assistance on water catchment systems and filtration to business owners who utilize captured water for business activities.
