SB 2566 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION. Requires that the Governor make nominations to fill vacancies on the Hawaiian Homes Commission in accordance with recommendations by representatives of Hawaiian homestead and beneficiary associations. Requires that the Governor make nominations to fill vacancies within sixty days. Requires that eligible candidates for nominations have a working knowledge of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920.	HWN, JDC
SB 2605 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INDEPENDENT LEGAL COUNSEL. Allows the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to retain independent counsel as needed whose legal fees are to be paid for by the State.	HWN, JDC/WAM
Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INDEPENDENT LEGAL COUNSEL. Allows the Department of Hawaiian home lands to retain independent legal counsel as needed. Authorizes the Department of Hawaiian home lands to use the services of the Attorney General as needed and when the interests of the State and the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands are aligned. SB 2608 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO GAMBLING. Requires the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to conduct a feasibility study of the potential revenue to be generated by limited gaming in the State and the potential public health and safety impacts of casino gambling. RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION ACT. HWN, JDC **SB 2623** Excludes from any waiting list maintained by the Department of Status & Hawaiian Home Lands any lessee or successor who sells or Testimony transfers their lease on a tract of Hawaiian home lands. **SB 3101** RELATING TO TAX EXEMPTION.
