### RELATING TO BACKGROUND CHECKS.

Authorizes the Department of Human Services to conduct comprehensive background checks on current and prospective employees, volunteers, and contractors, and a contractor's employees, agents, or volunteers, in positions that require them to be in close proximity to minors, young adults, or vulnerable adults who are receiving child welfare services, social services, or other benefits and services from the Department of Human Services intended to prevent abuse or neglect or assist youth

aging out of foster care with obtaining and maintaining independent living skills. Replaces the term "foster boarding home" in sections 321-11.2(d), 571-32.1, and 846 2.7(b)(8), Hawaii Revised Statutes, with "resource family homes", to conform to Act 133, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016. Effective

Status & Testimony RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

Defines "pre-contact historic property". Clarifies that the historic preservation program includes providing consultation to counties and public and private agencies involved in historic preservation and the development, publication, and distribution of materials about protections for burials, historic sites, and archaeological resources. Amends the composition and duties of the Hawaii historic places review board. Increases civil and administrative fines for certain violations of historic and preservation requirements and makes violators liable for costs associated with mitigation or restoration measures. Takes effect 7/1/2050.

RELATING TO MEDICAL CARE FOR MINORS.

Permits minors to consent to medical care related to the diagnosis or treatment of HIV or the prevention of HIV. Provides that a minor, under certain circumstances, shall not be liable for payment for treatment or prevention of HIV. Provides that a health insurer of a minor's parent, guardian, custodian, or spouse shall not notify the parent guardian, custodian, or spouse of the minor's treatment or prevention of HIV. Authorizes physician assistants, in addition to physicians and advanced practice registered nurses, to render medical care and services to minors. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD1)
