RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

Appropriates supplemental funds for the Judiciary for the fiscal biennium beginning 7/1/2021 and ending 6/30/2023. (HD2)

RELATING TO CHAPTER 92, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

Defines "board business" and "informal gatherings". Allows a board to prepare and circulate amongst members a statement on a position previously adopted for purposes of submission to the legislature, under certain circumstances. Outlines when board packets must be available to interested persons. Applies sunshine law to all adjudicatory functions concerning land use.

HB 2213, HD1 (HSCR792-22) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MAIL THEFT. Establishes the misdemeanor offense of theft of mail. Effective 1/1/2222. (HD1)	JDC
HB 2416, HD2 (HSCR945-22) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING. Informs the public of the true sources of dark money contributions by requiring section 501(c)(4) nonprofit organizations to disclose the name and address of donors who donate an aggregate of more than \$100, with certain exceptions. Adds definitions. Effective 7/1/2112. (HD2)	JDC
HB 1486, HD2 (HSCR936-22) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THEFT. Amends the offense of theft in the first degree to specifically include theft of a motor vehicle or motorcycle. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD2)	JDC
HB 1455, HD1 (HSCR788-22) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ROBBERY IN THE FIRST DEGREE. Amends the offense of robbery in the first degree to include being armed with an electric gun. Effective 1/1/2222. (HD1)	JDC
HB 1732, HD1 (HSCR787-22) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS. Prohibits individuals from carrying an electric gun in or near certain sensitive locations with exceptions. (HD1)	JDC
