Requires the commission to consider model programs including residential, inperson and community-based rehabilitation programs, supportive and subsidized housing, restorative justice, and educational programs.

HB 2313, HD1 (HSCR133-22) RELATING TO RISK AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT FOR FEMALE OFFENDERS.

Status

Requires the department of public safety to develop a pretrial female risk and needs assessment tool and conduct internal pretrial female risk and needs assessments to measure the female offender's risk of flight, criminal conduct, or harm to the community. Requires the pretrial female risk and needs assessment tool to consider factors important to women when considering their risk to reoffend and treatment needs.

HB 1778, HD1 (HSCR125-22) Status

RELATING TO THE COMPREHENSIVE OFFENDER REENTRY SYSTEM.

CMV, JHA, FIN

Requires the offender reentry office of the department of public safety to develop and implement a risk needs assessment tool that is specifically intended to assess the needs of female offenders. Requires

a report to the legislature. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing.
